PERSONS WANTED.

Ponsonby.—17th ultimo, on warrant for theft of a pair of trousers and west, the property of Robert Charles Gray, value £2 10s., John O'Brien, alias John O'Shea, age twenty-eight, height about 5 ft. 7 in. sailor and labourer, stiff build, fresh complexion, brown hart, clean - shaved, tattoo-marks on his arms, dressed in dark coat, light trousers, light-tweed cap, black kerchief round his neck; fond of drink.
