PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—11th ultimo, on **warrant** for theft of a cheque for £7 10s., the property of Elizabeth Young, Remuera, — **Young** (name supposed fictitious), age about forty, height 5 ft. 10 in., labourer, fair complexion, ginger moustache, medium build; dressed in blue-dungaree trousers, dark-tweed coat, blue-striped shirt, black hard hat. The complainant lost the cheque, and offender is supposed to have found it and then cashed it the same day at R. Gray and Sons, Symonds Street, drapers, in payment for goods purchased, and gave his name and address as Young, Mary Street, Mount Eden, but no trace of him can be obtained there.
