#### PERSONS WANTED.

Auckland.—11th ultimo, on warrant for theft of a cheque for £7 10s., the property of Elizabeth Young, Remuera, — Young (name supposed fictitious), age about forty, height 5 ft. 10 in., labourer, fair complexion, ginger moustache, medium build; dressed in blue-dungaree trousers, dark-tweed coat, blue-striped shirt, black hard hat.
