PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—16th ultimo, on **warrant** for obtaining a pair of boots, value £1, from James Adams, boot-importer, by false pretences, **Eleanor E. Christian, alias Williams**, age thirty-three, height 5 ft. 5 in., native of New Zealand, medium build, sallow complexion, dark-brown hair, hazel eyes, upper teeth artificial, scar over left eye; well dressed in green costume, straw hat with red flowers.
