## PERSONS WANTED.

**AUCKLAND.**—16th instant, on **warrant** for failing to provide for the future maintenance of his unborn illegitimate child, **Leonard Richardson**, age thirty-five, height 5 ft. 8 in., draper's assistant, native of New Zealand, slight build, dark complexion and hair, black moustache, brown eyes; dressed in navy-blue suit and black hard hat.
