PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—28th ultimo, that he may be compelled to contribute towards the support of his four children, inmates of the Auckland Institute for the Blind, **George Martin**, age fifty-four, height 6 ft. 1 in., carter, native of England, grey hair, blue eyes, sallow complexion; a very heavy smoker; generally wears a grey suit and hard-felt hat.
