PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—18th ultimo, on **warrant** for forging and uttering a cheque for £9 3s. to Maurice O'Connor, hotel-keeper, Auckland, **H. J. Barrett**, or **Darling** (names probably fictitious), age about twenty-nine, height 5 ft. 9 in., labourer, native of Australia, medium build, brown hair, clean-shaved, blue eyes, ridge on one or both thumb-nails; dressed in blue-grey suit and straw hat. The cheque was on the Bank of Australia, Auckland, purporting to be drawn by W. R. Daveney. It was indorsed by accused, H. J. Barrett. A man named Darling was employed by Mr. Daveney, and the signature on the cheque resembles his writing.

AUCKLAND.—31st ultimo, on **warrant** for obtaining £6 from John E. Hunt, hotelkeeper, Papakura, by means of a valueless cheque, **Evelyn V. Kitson**, age twenty-seven, height 5 ft. 9 in., about 10 st. weight, slim build, brown hair, small brown moustache only, bottom front teeth missing, small chin; dressed in grey or blue suit, boater hat or cap, carries a silver-mounted square cane. Offender represented himself as one of the English nobility, and represents that he has letters signed by the Premier of Tasmania (which may be forgeries) and has a distinguished visitor's railway-pass over the New Zealand Railways. Robert Horner**, age thirty-three, height 6 ft. 1 in., traveller and hawk, native of England, very slight build, fair complexion, brown hair, clean-shaved, consumptive appearance; dressed in green-coloured suit, straw hat, soft shirt, and very high collar; generally carries a black bag.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by section ten of the Gaming Amendment Act, 1910, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the provisions of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other Acts prohibiting lotteries, shall not apply to the Art Union of London, being a body corporate established by Royal Charter in the United Kingdom for the advancement of the fine arts.

Regulations for Deer-shooting, Nelson.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby

make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Nelson Acclimatization District, comprising the Counties of Waimea, Takaka, and Collingwood, and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

1. RED-DEER stags and fallow-deer bucks may be taken or killed within the Nelson Acclimatization District from the 25th day of February, 1911, to the 1st day of May, 1911, both days inclusive.

2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Nelson, and the Postmaster at Motueka, on payment of a license fee of £1 1s., in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.

3. No licensee shall take or kill more than six deer in all, whether red-deer stags or fallow-deer bucks; and no red-deer stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than four points, and no fallow-deer buck carrying antlers with less than four points.

4. No doe, hind, or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

6. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.
