PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—6th ultimo, on **warrant** of commitment to Mount Eden Prison for seven days in default of paying £2 10s. fine and costs for a breach of his prohibition order, **William Scott**, age nineteen, height 5 ft. 7 in., seaman, native of New Zealand, medium build, fresh complexion, fair hair, grey eyes; generally wears dark suit and green-tweed cap.
