PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—7th August last, on **warrant** for theft of a kit of tools, the property of Arthur Maddaford, carpenter, **James A. Groves** (name probably fictitious), age about twenty-eight, height about 5 ft. 5 in., carpenter, well built, supposed clean-shaved, peculiar manner of speech. He can be identified by ex-Judge Button, who purchased the tools. (See *Police Gazette*, 1911, page 401.)

NEWTON (AUCKLAND).—31st ultimo, that she may be compelled to contribute towards the support of her children, inmates of an industrial school, **Louisa Griffiths, alias Mrs. Young**, age about forty, height about 5 ft. 5 in. or 6 in., supposed boardinghouse-keeper, native of New Zealand, stout build, fair hair, ruddy complexion. She is supposed to be going under an assumed name. Inquiry by the Education Department.
