

Coaching for Police Examinations.

All members of the Police Force are hereby directed to exercise their utmost diligence to ensure a complete observance of the provisions of the Animals Protection Acts respecting the unlawful possession or exportation of specimens (alive or dead) of imported or native game.

Immediate confidential inquiry is to be made regarding a Mr. Douglas A. Sinclair, described as a professional orchid-hunter, age thirty-three years, who allegedly left England in January last under commission by notable collectors of rare birds and animals to study the bird-life in New Zealand, and will probably endeavour to obtain a collection of our native game. Officers in charge of districts will furnish me with the result thereof at their earliest convenience.

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

In Note of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Southland Acclimatization District, exclusive of all sanctuaries, and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

1. Red deer (stags only) may be taken or killed within the Southland Acclimatization District, exclusive of all sanctuaries, from the 1st day of May, 1913, to the 31st day of May, 1913, both days inclusive.

2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Invercargill on payment of a license fee of £5 5s., in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations; provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.

3. No licensee shall take or kill more than four stags, and no stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than ten

points.

4. No hind or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever, and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing

any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

6. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.
