

MURRAY v. REID AND ANOTHER.

Mandamus—Dismissal of Information by Magistrate—Decision on Merits—Appeal, not Mandamus, Procedure to question Decision—Charge of Offence under Section 41, Gaming Act, 1908—No Notice of Intention to prosecute—Notice not necessary—The Gaming Act, 1908, Section 74.

A was charged with an offence under section 41 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and pleaded "Not guilty." Her counsel, having obtained from the informant an admission that no notice in writing of the intention to prosecute had been given to her, thereupon contended that such a notice was necessary under section 74 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and that the information should be dismissed. The Magistrate held that this objection was fatal, and, without hearing evidence, dismissed the information. The informant moved for a writ of mandamus to command the Magistrate to hear and determine the information.

Held, 1. That no notice of intention to prosecute was necessary, section 74 being enacted for the protection of persons acting in pursuance or intended pursuance of the powers conferred by the Act, and not for the protection of persons charged with having violated the provisions of the Act.

That the Magistrate's decision was an adjudication on the merits, and that appeal, and not mandamus, was therefore the informant's proper remedy.

Sutherland v. McGimpsey (17 N.Z. L.R. 431; 1 Gaz. L.R. 28.) followed.

MOTION for writ of mandamus. The facts are set out in the judgment of Sim, J.

Macassey, for the plaintiff:—
Two points arise: 1. Was the Magistrate's ruling wrong?
2. Will a mandamus lie to compel the Magistrate to hear and determine the information? It was admitted the Magistrate's ruling was wrong. Section 290 of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908, allows an appeal only after hearing and determination; so also sections 68 to 73. Here there was no hearing and determination, as the Magistrate decided a point preliminary to the laying of the information. The principle is, Is the objection such that whatever the merits of the case, whether the defendant be guilty or not, the Justices should hold that they cannot decide upon the merits owing to the objection in point of law—e.g., want of parties or of notice? Such holding is a declining of jurisdiction, and not an adjudication: Reg. v. Brown (7 E. & B. 757); Paley on Summary Convictions (8th ed. 93); Shortt on Mandamus (p. 248.); Ex parte Deedo (1 Legge (N.S.W.) 193); Rex v. Gloucestershire Justices (1B. & Ad. 1). Burgess v. Moody (7 N.Z. L.R. 320) is distinguishable, because the Magistrate heard and decided a point going to the merits of

Sutherland v. McGimpsey (17 N.Z. L.R. 431; the case. Suberiand v. McGimpsey (17 N.Z. L.R. 431; 1 Gaz. L.R. 28) is distinguishable. There the point, whether the complaint was laid in time, was clearly within the ambit of the Magistrate's jurisdiction. Here the question was not whether the information was laid in time, but whether a step, the giving of notice preliminary to the lay-ing of the information, had been taken. This was clearly beyond the ambit of the Magistrate's jurisdiction, and did not go to the merits of the information: Johnston v. Mo-Arthur (5 Gaz. L.R. 310); James v. Butler (25 N.Z. L.R. 382).

Menteath, for the defendants :-

Mandamus is an extraordinary remedy, and only available where there is no other remedy. Here the remedy was by way of appeal: Reg. v. Dayman (7 E. & B. 672); Tenneut v. Greenfield (18 N.Z. L.R. 59); Reg. v. Cotham ([1898] 1 Q B.D. 802).

Macassey, in reply:— Reg. v. Cotham ([1898] 1 Q.B.D. 802) is an authority in our favour. Clearly there was no adjudication, as the Magistrate asked counsel for the defendant to waive the point of notice so that he could decide the case on the merits. It is not necessary that the word "decline," or any equivalent to it, should be used by the Magistrate, but there should be enough to show that the party withholds compliance and distinctly determines not to do what is required: Shortt on Mandamus (p. 248).

Sim, J.:

This is a motion for a writ of mandamus commanding Mr. Reid, the Stipendiary Magistrate at Carterton, to hear and determine an information charging the defendant Elizabeth Bowe with an offence under section 41 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

When the case was called on before the Magistrate the defendant Bowe pleaded "Not guilty." Her counsel, having obtained from the informant an admission that no notice in writing of the intention to prosecute the defendant had been given to her, thereupon contended that such a notice was necessary under section 74 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and that the information should be dismissed on this ground. The Magistrate held that this objection was fatal, and without hearing any evidence, dismissed the information.

It is clear that the deci ion of the Magistrate was wrong. The provisions of section 74 were enacted for the protection of persons acting in pursuance or intended pursuance of the powers conferred by the Act, and not for the protection of persons charged with having violated the provisions of the Act. The only question is whether the decision of the Magistrate was an erroneous decision on the merits, or amounted, in effect, to a refusal to hear and determine the case. If the decision was on the merits, then, however wrong it may have been, it cannot be reviewed by process of mandamus: Reg. v. Cotham ([1898] 1 Q.B. 802, at p. 806). If, however, the erroneous decision was on a point preliminary to the hearing, then there is jurisdiction to interfere by mandamus. The distinction between the two is often very It certainly does not depend upon the time at which the objection was taken; a preliminary objection cannot be turned into a defence on the merits by being kept back to a late stage of the proceedings: Reg. v. Brown (7 E. & B. 757, at p. 761). And, conversely, what is really a defence on the merits does not lose its character as such by being raised, as it was here, in the form of a preliminary objection.

I think that in the present case the decision of the Magistrate was a decision on the merits. What he held was that, assuming the defendant Bowe to have been guilty of the alleged offence, the failure to give her notice under section 74 of the Act was a complete answer to the information. He considered that section, and came to the conclusion that it applied to the case, and as it had not been complied with he was bound to dismiss the information. That plainly was an adjudication on the merits, and not a refusal to adjudicate. The plaintiff's proper remedy,

therefore, is by appeal.

The case is not distinguishable from that of Sutherland v. McGimpsey (17 N.Z. L.R. 431; 1 Gaz. L.R. 28), in which a Magistrate decided erroneously that in affiliation cases under Magistrate decided erroneously that in affiliation cases under the Destitute Persons Act the limitation of six months for making complaints, provided by the Justices of the Peace Act, ran from the date of the birth of the child. On an application for mandamus it was held that the Magistrate had not declined jurisdiction. "It is clear," said Prender-gast, C.J., "that the Magistrate did not decline jurisdiction in the sense of refusing to hear at all, or in the sense of deciding against the complainant on a point preliminary to the hearing on the merits; he decided, in effect, on a defence made by the respondent." That describes exactly what happened in the present case.

The motion for a mandamus, therefore, must be dismissed. Costs were not allowed to the defendants in Sutherland v. McGimpsey (17 N.Z. L.R. 431; 1 Gaz. L.R. 28), and I shall

not allow any costs to the defendants in this case.




