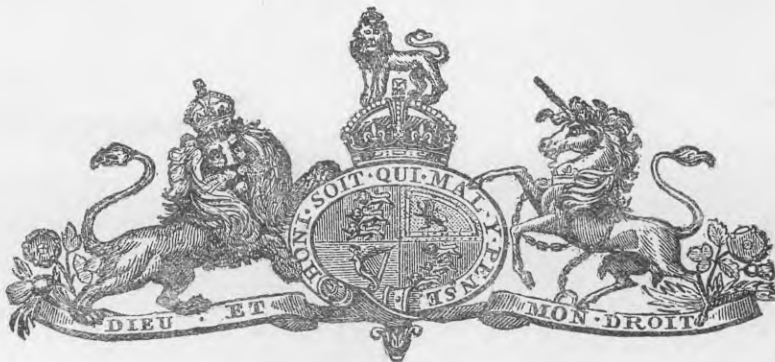

PERSONS WANTED.

WHANGAREI.—24th October last, on **warrant** of commitment to Auckland Prison for seven days in default of paying £19 1s. arrears due on a maintenance order for the support of his children, **Alfred Johnston**, age thirty-five, height 5 ft. 8 in., labourer and fireman, native of Sweden, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair, brown eyes; usually dressed in blue suit and green soft hat; fond of drink.

AUCKLAND.—27th August last, on **warrant** of commitment to military custody for twenty-eight days in default of paying £5 13s. fine and costs for a breach of the Defence Act, **Alfred Kennedy**, age twenty, height 6 ft., labourer,
