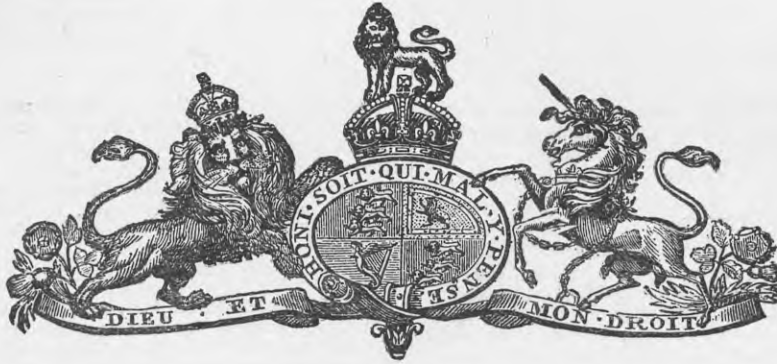

PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—**Frederick Robert Keeper**, default of maintenance: Accused was working at Taumarunui some time ago under the name **Fred Williams**. He may be found cooking at some hotel or boardinghouse under that name. (See *Police Gazette*, 1913, page 731.)

AUCKLAND.—2nd instant, on **warrant** for failing to maintain his wife, **Joseph Foote Richards**, age thirty-five, height 6 ft. 2 in., land agent, native of New Zealand, broad build, dark hair, tanned complexion, brown eyes. Complainant, Marjorie Richards, 53 Cooke Street, Auckland.

AUCKLAND.—1st instant, on **warrant** for theft of a water-proof overcoat, value £1 15s. (recovered), the property of Messrs. Smith and Caughy, drapers, Queen Street, **William Davidson**, *alias* **Ferguson**, age forty-seven, height 5 ft. 6 in., labourer, native of New Zealand, medium build, fair complexion, light-brown hair, hazel eyes, scar over left

AUCKLAND.—4th instant, on **warrant** for vagrancy, **Ethel Evelyn Patterson**, age eighteen, height 5 ft. 5 in., domestic, native of New Zealand, medium build, pale complexion, sharp features, brown hair, blue eyes. Her parents reside in Whangarei. Her photograph is filed in the Superintendent's Office, Auckland.

AUCKLAND.—30th March last, on **warrant** of commitment to Auckland Prison for two months in default of paying £17 5s. arrears due on a maintenance order for the support of his child, **Joseph Mooney**, age twenty-nine, height 5 ft. 9 in., cook and labourer, native of New Zealand, slight build, dark complexion, black hair and moustache, brown eyes, walks with a slight limp. THAMES.—2nd instant, on **warrant** for abduction, **William Roycroft**, age twenty-four, height 5 ft. 7½ in., farm labourer, native of New Zealand, medium build, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, brown eyes; dressed in dark clothes, and wearing a straw hat. Accused abducted **Mavis Comer**, a girl of sixteen years of age. When last seen she was wearing a red dress and a Panama hat. She has dark-brown hair and eyes.

HAMILTON.—22nd ultimo, on **warrant** for false pretences, **Henry Taylor, alias Alfred Whitehead**, age thirty-nine, height 5 ft. 6½ in., labourer, native of Australia, medium build, sallow complexion, black hair, hazel eyes, long nose, scar on right forearm and on right side of head, cast in left eye. Accused obtained board and lodging to the value of 9s. from Alice Sanders, boardinghouse-keeper, Victoria Street, by falsely representing that he was employed by the Hamilton Borough Council. TE KUITI.—4th instant, that summonses for obscene language and wilful damage may be served on him, **Harold Walker**, age thirty, height 5 ft. 8½ in., bootmaker or labourer, native of New Zealand, fresh complexion, light-brown hair, blue eyes, medium build, broken nose, heart and bird on right forearm, scars on left ring and little fingers, right little finger contracted. Accused trained complainant's horse "Baxter," and took it to the Auckland Trotting Races, where it won a race, value £125. Accused and complainant were to divide this amount, but accused cleared out without doing so. There are other charges pending.

NAPIER.—28th October last, on **warrant** of commitment to Napier Prison for six months in default of paying £41 5s. arrears due on a maintenance order for the support of his wife, **John Francis Wooster**, age twenty-nine, height 5 ft. 4½ in., hotel cook, native of New Zealand, medium build, fair hair and complexion, blue eyes, flat nose, pieced heart on left forearm, scar on left leg; very fond of drink. WAVERLEY.—22nd October, 1912, on **warrant** for failing to maintain his illegitimate child, **Helmer Lars Sundberg**, age twenty-six, height 5 ft. 11 in., sawmill hand and labourer, native of Sweden, medium build, fair hair and complexion, clean-shaven, large ears, full-rigged ship, "Sweden," crossed flags and clasped hands on right forearm, harp and dagger on right wrist, speaks broken English. MARTON.—22nd December last, on **warrant** for failing to comply with the terms of a maintenance order for the support of his wife, **George Grey**, age thirty, height 5 ft. 10 in., butcher, cook, or hotel porter, native of England, medium build, fair hair and complexion, grey eyes. Drunken habits. Complainant, Lottie Ethel Grey, Marton.

FEILDING.—13th January last, on **warrant** for failing to maintain his children, **Joseph Feetham**, age thirty-five, height 5 ft. 7 in., labourer, native of New Zealand, medium build, fair fresh complexion, light-brown hair and moustache, blue-grey eyes. Boil-marks and cuts on hands. He may be found working at a sawmill or flax-mill under the name **J. E. Ross**. He has been living with a woman named Ellen Watimes, a widow, and a quarter-caste Maori, who is well known in Akarua.

OTAKI.—4th instant, on **warrant** for false pretences, **L. Smith, alias John Leslie Winstone**, age twenty-eight, height 5 ft. 10 in., clerk, native of England, fresh complexion, brown hair, blue eyes; dressed when last seen in grey suit, tan leggings, black hard hat and overcoat. Accused obtained goods to the value of £3 from Harold Frederick Ernest Cockrell, storekeeper, by means of a valueless cheque for that amount on the Bank of Australasia, Otaki. Other similar charges will probably be preferred against him. (See *Police Gazette*, 1913, page 345, and Photographs, 1913, page 43.)

CARTERTON.—5th February last, on **warrant** of commitment to Wellington Prison for seven days in default of paying £3 8s. fine and costs for threatening behaviour, **William Tancred**, age twenty-one, height 5 ft. 9 in., butcher and labourer, native of New Zealand, fresh freckled complexion, brown hair, blue eyes, medium build; usually employed at freezing-works. PETONE.—27th March last, on **warrant** of commitment to military custody for fourteen days in default of paying £5 10s. fine and costs for a breach of the Defence Act, **Victor Hawthorne**, age twenty-two, height 5 ft. 7 in., labourer, native of New Zealand, medium build, ruddy complexion, fair hair worn long in front, blue eyes; generally wears riding-breeches.

WELLINGTON.—8th instant, on **warrant** for forgery and uttering, **H. King** (name probably fictitious), age about twenty five, height about 5 ft. 6 in., supposed native of New Zealand, full face, dark complexion, medium build; well dressed in dark suit. Accused forged the name of C. J. Roberts to a cheque for £5 12s. 6d. on the National Bank of New Zealand, Te Aro, and uttered same to Fark Cohen, clothier, 43 Willis Street, in payment of an account, receiving £3 1s. 10d. in cash. The cheque is from a book Nos. O. 94889 to O. 94912, which was stolen from the Central Meat Company, Vivian Street, about the end of last month.

WELLINGTON.—30th March last, on **warrant** of commitment to Wellington Prison for one month in default of paying £1 16s. fine and costs for a breach of his prohibition order, **Harry Swanson, alias William Freeman**, age twenty-four, height 5 ft. 6 in., seaman and labourer, native of England, medium build, fair hair and complexion, blue eyes; sword, heart, true love, and Rhodda on left forearm; dirty appearance; fond of drink.

WELLINGTON.—6th instant, on **warrant** for deserting from the s.s. "Star of Victoria," **John Barton**, age thirty-three, height 6 ft. 1½ in., dark complexion, brown eyes; anchor and snake, dragon and caterpillar on right arm; butterfly and fish on left arm.

WELLINGTON.—7th instant, on **warrant** for deserting from the s.s. "Ruahine," **James Ellis**, age twenty-two, height 5 ft. 10½ in., trimmer, native of England, dark complexion, brown hair, blue eyes; anchor and heart on left forearm, scar on right wrist.

WELLINGTON.—9th ultimo, on **warrant** for failing to maintain his wife, **Sydney Evelyn Budgett**, chemist (no description available). Complainant, Annie Budgett, care of D. M. Findlay, solicitor, Wellington.

Accused forged the signature of Messrs. Moody and McQuillan to a cheque for £6 7s. on the Union Bank of Australia, Rangiora, and attempted to utter same to one John Ashley, hotelkeeper, Sefton. Accused obtained £1 17s. from John Rossiter, sawmiller, Ashley, by falsely representing that an order for wages due to him was correct when he had previously falsified it, making it appear to be for £1 17s. more than it should have been. He also borrowed a bicycle from complainant's son, John William Rossiter, which he has not returned. Description: Gentleman's Reliance, No. 288900, black-enamelled with red stripes, free wheel, rat-trap pedals, new Continental tire on front wheel, old tire on back wheel; value, £8. LYTTLETON.—7th instant, on **warrant** for deserting from the s.s. "Corinthic," **G. Cook**, age thirty-four, height 5 ft. 3 in., fireman, native of England, medium build, dark complexion, brown hair and moustache, one knee stiff.

CHRISTCHURCH.—1st ultimo, on **warrant** for attempted false pretences, **Edward James Griffin**, age thirty-three, height 5 ft. 6½ in., labourer, native of New Zealand, thin build, fresh complexion, light-brown hair, blue eyes, scar on left side of upper lip, freckled face. Accused attempted to obtain a truck of coal, valued at £7 4s., from the Homebush Coal Company by falsely representing himself to be J. Curragh, traction-engine owner, of Templeton. Accused obtained board and lodging to the value of £4 1s. from James Wallace, boardinghouse-keeper, by falsely representing that he was employed on the *Otago Daily Times*.

DUNEDIN.—27th ultimo, on **warrant** of commitment to military custody for seven days in default of paying 15s. fine and costs for a breach of the Defence Act, **Eliphalet Hall Ravenswood**, age seventeen, height 5 ft. 2 in., farm labourer, native of New Zealand, slim build, fair hair and complexion, blue eyes. He is at present in Queensland.
