

#### PERSONS WANTED.

MASTERTON.—About the second week in April last, from Mr. Cotter's store, at Te Wharau, the property of RICHARD BARRER, sheep-farmer, four stags' heads. Description: (1) A "Royal" twelve-pointer, mounted on polished rimu shield, skin has a beard hanging down below neck, eyes protruding; (2) a malformed head, mounted, minus shield, the crown of one side has a hammer-like bone representing a point, the other crown has flange-like growth nearly as broad as a man's hand and about 1½ in. thick, on the other side a second growth of horn forms the pedicle, which was broken off while fighting, another bit of horn like the handle of a stick has been grafted with an iron bolt; (3) a fourteen pointer, no shield to it, the brow-boy and tray-times are well grown and uniform, an unusually even head; (4) a fifteen-pointer, irregular, at one side of head it has a complete cup, at same side the boy-tine is missing, on the other side the brow-boy and tray-times are well grown, times on same horn at top are very heavy and grown straight from the main beam terminal.
