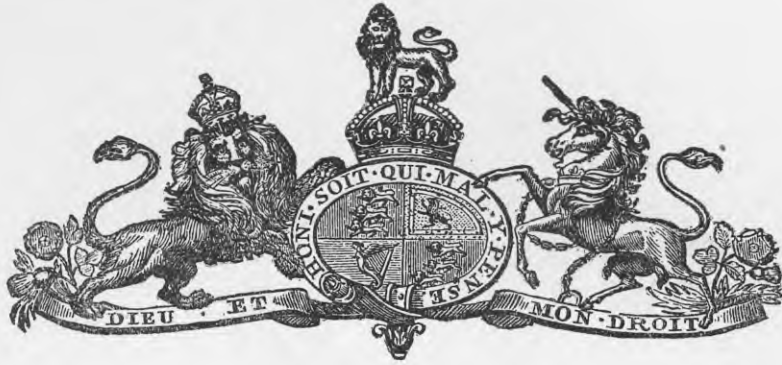

Identifiable except money.
