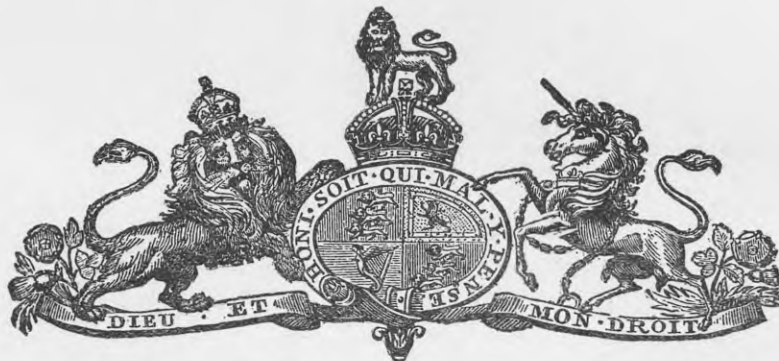

SPECIAL INQUIRY.

OUTRAM.—3rd instant. Information is required as to the identity of a **Man** whose body was found in an advanced stage of decomposition in the bush at Maungatua on the 26th ultimo. His description is as follows: Age about forty-five to fifty, height about 5 ft. 10 in., supposed labourer, dark hair, partly bald, very bad teeth, strong build, weight about 12 stone; dressed in a shabby grey-tweed suit, soft grey shirt, dark cap, tan lace-up boots (about size 9). The cause of death was suicide by taking lysol. The body is supposed to be that of a man (name unknown) who was looking for work in the vicinity of Maungatua about the end of July last.
