Regulations for Deer-shooting, Canterbury Acclimatization District.

LIVERPOOL, Governor

In exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Canterbury Acclimatization District, and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

Rep-deer stags may be taken or killed within the Canterbury Acclimatization District from the 1st day of April, 1915, to the 10th day of May, 1915 (both days inclusive).
Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the

2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Christchurch, upon the recommendation of the secretary of the Canterbury Acclimatization Society, on payment of a license fee of £5, in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations. The number of such licenses to be issued by the said Chief Postmaster shall not exceed eight. Provided
