

ABANDONED CHILD.

CHRISTCHURCH.—On the 4th instant a male child was found in a hollow tree on the banks of the Avon. Description: Age about six weeks; circumcised. Wrapped in a black cape similar to those worn by elderly women.

PERSONS WANTED.

From the Royal New Zealand Artillery.
