I N exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liver-pool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do pool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in that part of the Rotorua Accli-matization District comprised in the Mahia Peninsula which is in the said acclimatization district, and the con-ditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Postmaster at Opoutama, on payment of a license fee of ± 3 , in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations. The num-ber of such licenses shall not exceed eight; provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.

3. No licensee shall take or kill more than two stags, and no stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than ten points.

4. No hind or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing

any person to sell any deer or portion thereof. 6. Regulations as to deer "tags," per New Zealand Gazette No. 40, Vol. I, of 20th May, 1909, page 1408, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the Postmaster at Opoutama immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued.
