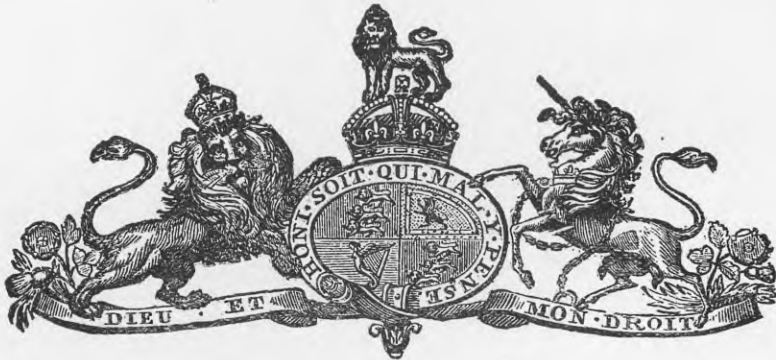

The arrest of offenders described in the *Police Gazette*, or respecting whom crime reports have been forwarded for insertion in the *Gazette*, should be promptly notified by the members of the Force effecting the arrest.

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with theft or suspected of theft, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, shall be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

All communications concerning this *Gazette* should be addressed to the Commissioner of Police, Wellington, and the envelope marked "For *Gazette*." Members of the Force in charge of out-stations will forward them *direct*.

## PERSONS WANTED.

**AUCKLAND.**—Between the 21st April and the 24th May last, on **warrant** for theft of £30 8s., the property of the New Zealand Government (Native Land Board), **Lionel Fitzherbert Williams** (known as **Son Williams**), age thirty-eight, height about 5 ft. 8 in., clerk, native of New Zealand, strong build, dark swarthy complexion, dark hair going bald, brown eyes, full face, thick lips; usually dressed in a light rough-tweed suit and green-felt hat or cap. Accused, who was cashier in the Native Land Court, received the amount on behalf of the Department and failed to account for it.

Accused forged the name of W. Godkin to a cheque for £10 on the National Bank of New Zealand, and uttered it to Newton King, land agent. (See following paragraph.)

HAWERA.—22nd ultimo, on **warrant** for false pretences, **Bruce McDonald**, age fifty, height 6 ft., labourer, native of Scotland, good build, fresh complexion, grey hair, scar and slight swelling on left side of lower lip. He frequently plays a violin about hotels, and boasts of having been left a large sum of money. Accused obtained £3 from Thomas Harvie, hotelkeeper, by means of a valueless cheque for £5 on the Bank of New Zealand, Stratford. (See preceding paragraph.)

HASTINGS.—18th August last, on **warrant** for forgery and uttering, **C. Davidson** (name probably fictitious), age about twenty-seven, height about 5 ft. 9 in., supposed labourer, medium build, fair complexion, auburn hair. Accused forged the name of F. ## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of September, 1915.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-ninth day of the same month, regulations were made for trout-fishing in the Rotorua Acclimatization District: And whereas it is desirable to amend the said regulations:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend the said regulations of the twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, by making the following additions to clauses three and nine thereof:—

Clause 3.—Provided that the season for trout-fishing in that portion of the Wanganui River and its tributaries which are within the boundaries of the Rotorua Acclimatization District shall open on the 1st day of October and close on the 30th day of April in each year.

Clause 9.—Provided that in respect of the Wanganui River and its tributaries which are within the boundaries of the Rotorua Acclimatization District the dates 1st June and 31st October in line 3 shall be 1st May to 30th September.
