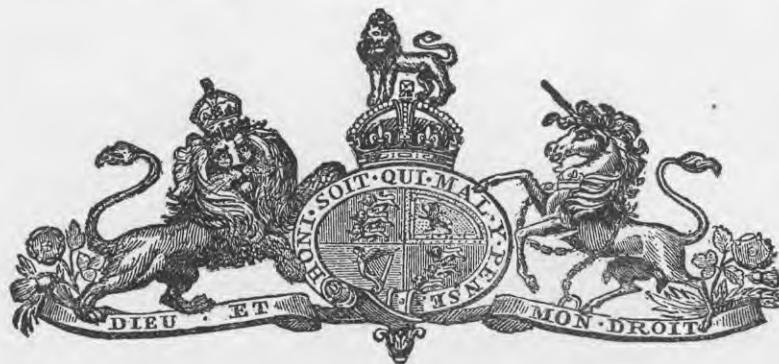

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with theft or suspected of theft, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, shall be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

PERSONS WANTED.

PONSONBY.—18th ultimo, that a copy of a minute of order under the Destitute Persons Act may be served upon him, **Frank Clement Baddeley**, age thirty-three, height 5 ft. 9 in., plumber, native of New Zealand, slim build, sallow complexion, dark hair going grey, hazel eyes (one pupil larger than the other), artificial teeth, one thumb-nail missing.

AUCKLAND.—19th instant, on **warrant** for theft of five horses (recovered), value £126, the property of Robert Fleming and others, Ngaruawahia, **George Snow** (name probably fictitious), age about thirty-four, height about 5 ft. 8 in., native of New Zealand, medium build, fresh complexion; dressed in a greenish-grey suit and soft-felt hat. Accused forwarded five horses from Hikutai to Auckland per s.s. "Whakatere," and instructed the New Zealand Loan and Mercantile Agency Company to sell them on his behalf. After the sale it was ascertained that the horses were stolen. The photograph of **Robert Barker, alias Adair, &c.**, in Photographs, 1913, page 36, has been identified as that of accused. He may be in company with **John Williams, alias Winslade**, referred to in the *Police Gazette*, 1915, page 441, and Photographs, 1910, page 22, who is suspected of being a party to the offence.

AUCKLAND.—8th instant, on **warrant** for having obtained £160 on credit, on the 29th June last, within three years next before the presentation of a bankruptcy petition against him, **Charles Henry Lord**, age twenty-four, height about 5 ft. 6 in., ex wine and spirit merchant, native of New Zealand, good build, fair hair and complexion, round face; usually well dressed in a grey suit. Accused, who was in business as a wine and spirit merchant at Auckland, was adjudged bankrupt on the 7th instant.

AUCKLAND.—1st instant, on **warrant** for false pretences, **A. R. P. Beste**, age forty, height 5 ft. 9 in., salesman and accountant, native of America, strong build, fair complexion, wavy fair hair, blue eyes, scar on upper lip. Accused obtained two rings and a watch, value £30, from William Rainger, jeweller, Victoria Buildings, by falsely representing that he had received a large sum of money from his father.

AUCKLAND.—8th August last, on **warrant** of commitment to Auckland Prison for fourteen days in default of paying £5 10s. fine and costs for cruelty to a horse, **Edward Edwin Crotty**, age twenty-seven, height 5 ft. 8 in., groom and jockey, native of New Zealand, medium build, fresh complexion, brown hair, hazel eyes, scar on right upper arm and forearm, wart on right little finger. AUCKLAND.—25th January last, for forgery and uttering, **Allan Edward George McCorquindale**, age eighteen, height about 5 ft., labourer and driver, native of New Zealand, strong build, pale complexion, brown hair and eyes. He is suspected of having forged the name of his employer, W. H. Hall, to a cheque for £5 10s., and uttered it to the Bank of New Zealand, Auckland. He is identical with **Allan McCorquindale**, referred to in *Police Gazette*, 1915, page 147. **No warrant.**

AUCKLAND.—6th instant, for escaping from the Inebriates' Home, Rotorua Island, **Daniel Morgan**, age thirty-eight, height 5 ft. 6 in., labourer, native of Ireland, fresh complexion, brown hair, blue eyes, Japanese woman on right forearm. He may be identical with **Daniel Morgan, alias Sloan, &c.**, referred to in *Police Gazette*, 1914, page 757.

AUCKLAND.—19th instant, on **warrant** for failing to maintain his wife, **James Railton**, age about thirty-seven, height about 5 ft. 8 in., native of New Zealand, slight build, dark complexion, black hair, brown eyes, three small moles on left cheek. Complainant, Jessie Jane Railton, Ponsonby. (See *Police Gazette*, 1911, page 16.)

AUCKLAND.—21st instant, that he may be compelled to pay £68 8s. arrears of maintenance due for the support of his child, **Isaac Carn**, age sixty, height 5 ft. 7½ in., labourer and gum-digger, native of England, medium build, fresh complexion, black hair, brown eyes, large nose, some upper teeth missing, two right fingers deformed.
