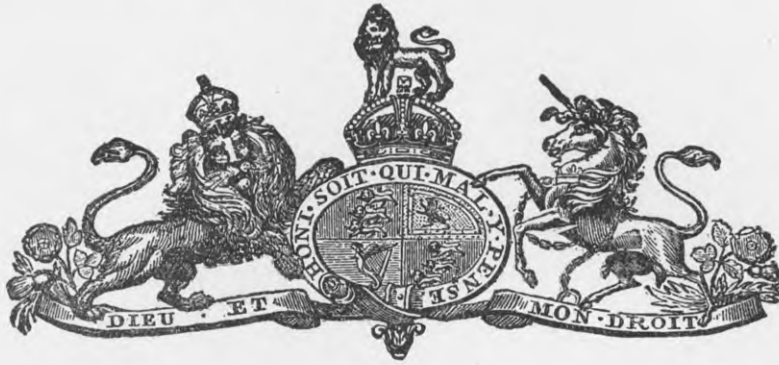

SPECIAL INQUIRY.

DUNEDIN.—14th instant, urgent inquiries are to be made with a view to ascertaining the mother of a female child whose body was found on the 18th ultimo on the rocks under Birch Street Wharf. It was wrapped in a piece of brown paper. At the inquest the medical evidence was to the effect that it was a still-born seven-months child.

Any information relating to the parentage of the child is to be telegraphed to the Superintendent of Police, Dunedin.
