PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—20th October, 1915, that he may be located, **John Peter Dornbush, alias Thornbush**, age about forty-six, height about 5 ft. 8 in., labourer, native of Germany, strong build, ruddy complexion, brown hair and moustache turning grey, blue eyes, round shoulders; usually dressed in a navy-blue-serge suit and tweed cap. The above are the photographs of **Emerald Tighe, alias Emmille Tighe, alias O'Neill**, and **Frederick George O'Neill, alias Tighe**, who are wanted along with **Norman Astor, alias Pascoe Lambert, alias Norman Pascoe**, and **James Dewar, alias E. Dewar**, by the Sydney police, on charges of having on or about the 11th ultimo, forged and uttered Commonwealth £5 bank-notes. Descriptions: First, age twenty-eight, height 5 ft. 10 in., medium build, dark complexion, clean-shaved; dresses well; wears pince-nez; an engineer (looks older than photo). Second, age thirty-seven, height 5 ft. 8 in., strong build, dark complexion; dressed when last seen in a black suit, blue cloth overcoat, and black velour hat; an ex-bookmaker. His photograph is a good one, except that he is now stouter and wears glasses. This offender was arrested at Melbourne on above charge and bailed to appear at Sydney, but failed to do so. Third: Age twenty-eight, height 5 ft. 10 in., medium build, dark complexion, clean-shaved; dressed when last seen in a grey sac suit and slate-coloured soft-felt hat; an artist. Fourth, age twenty-nine, height 5 ft. 10 in., thin build, dark complexion, clean-shaved; dressed in a blue suit and black soft-felt hat; a linotype operator. They are said to each have about five hundred of the forged notes in their possession. Warrants have been issued for the arrest (with the exception of **Frederick George O'Neill, alias Tighe**) of these men. If located, or any information obtained regarding them, an urgent communication is to be sent to the Commissioner of Police, Wellington. (See *New South Wales Police Gazette*, 1916, page 409.) Amendment Act, 1910, for the period ending on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, with respect to hawks of all species.

Lands temporarily reserved.

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

WHEREAS by the three-hundred-and-twenty-first section of the Land Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned :

And whereas by the sixty-ninth section of the Land for Settlements Act, 1908, it is further provided that the Governor may from time to time, as he thinks fit, set aside reserves for any specified public purpose out of land acquired under the last-mentioned Act, provided that no land so acquired shall be set aside for endowments :

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the said Acts, do hereby temporarily reserve from sale the lands described in the Schedule hereunder written, for the purposes in the said Schedule specified at the end of the respective descriptions of the lands so intended to be temporarily reserved.

SCHEDULE.

AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 3 acres 1 rood 21 perches, more or less, being Allotment 376, Parish of Waimana. Bounded towards the north by Allotment 333 of the said Waimana Parish, 932-1 links; towards the east and south-west by Allotment 363 of the aforesaid parish, 863-2 and 284-3 links respectively; towards the west generally by a road reserve along the Waimana River, 452-2 and 585-2 links; be all the aforesaid linkages more or less. All that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District, containing by admeasurement 3 roods 10-9 perches, more or less, being Section 11, Town of Motu Extension No. 1, Block II, Motu Survey District. MILITARY SERVICE ACT, 1916.

ENROLMENT OF EXPEDITIONARY FORCE RESERVE.

BY Proclamations dated respectively 1st and 2nd September, 1916, the enrolment of the Reserve is directed. Enrolment must be made not later than 15th September (First Division) or 16th September (Second Division).

The Reserve consists of men not less than twenty and under forty-six years of age.

The Reserve Register is based on the National Register.

Men not already registered must supply enrolment-cards not later than 16th September.

Men already registered need not supply an enrolment-card, but must, not later than 16th September, notify present address if place of abode has changed since registration.

Men reaching military age, or arriving in Dominion after 16th September, must supply enrolment-cards within fourteen days thereafter.

Changes of abode after enrolment must be notified within fourteen days.

The Act makes the Reservist's obligation to do any of the above things a personal one, and he is not relieved by information previously given to recruiting officer or committee.

Men not enrolled may be sent straight to camp.

Men who fail to notify change of address may become liable on a charge of desertion.

Employers of Reservists not enrolled, or of deserters, are liable to heavy fines or imprisonment.

For protection of Reservists certificates of enrolment will be issued as soon as practicable after receipt of application on form provided.

Call at nearest post-office for forms, information, and assistance.

Onus of proof in every case is on the defendant.

Regulations under the War Regulations Amendment Act, 1916.

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this second day of September, 1916.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

I, ARTHUR WILLIAM DE BRITO SAVILE, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, do hereby, in pursuance of the authority conferred upon me by section three of the War Regulations Amendment Act, 1916, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, make the following regulations under that Act.

REGULATIONS.

1. AN attorney, agent, trustee, executor, or administrator who, being a member of an Expeditionary Force under the Expeditionary Forces Act, 1915, is absent from New Zealand on His Majesty's Service, or is about to leave New Zealand on such service, may by a power of attorney executed by him delegate to the Public Trustee all or any of the powers, functions, or duties conferred or imposed upon him as such attorney, agent, trustee, executor, or administrator.

2. In pursuance of such delegation and within the limits thereof the Public Trustee may, at all times while the grantor of the power of attorney is absent from New Zealand on His Majesty's Service, exercise and perform in New Zealand on behalf of the grantor all powers, functions, and duties, vested in or imposed upon him in his capacity as attorney, agent, trustee executor, or administrator.

3. All acts so done by the Public Trustee in pursuance of any such delegation shall have the same force and effect as if done by the attorney, agent, trustee, executor, or administrator in his capacity as such.

4. An act so done by the Public Trustee in good faith and in intended pursuance of any such delegation, and without notice of the fact that the grantor of the power of attorney has died, or has

revoked the power of attorney, or has ceased to be an attorney, agent, trustee, executor, or administrator as aforesaid, or is no longer absent from New Zealand on His Majesty's service, shall not be invalidated by that fact, but shall have the same effect and operation as if the fact was otherwise.

5. The grantor of any such power of attorney shall be under no liability in respect of any default or misfeasance of the Public Trustee in the exercise of the powers conferred upon him by these regulations, and the Public Trustee shall in respect of any such default or misfeasance incur the same liabilities as if he had himself been the attorney, agent, trustee, executor, or administrator on whose behalf he has so acted.

6. For all services rendered by the Public Trustee under any such power of attorney he shall be entitled to receive from the grantor of that power such remuneration as shall be agreed upon, and in default of agreement such remuneration as is fixed by the Public Trust Office Board.

7. Nothing in the foregoing regulations shall in any manner affect or take away any power of delegation which may be possessed by the attorney, agent, trustee, executor, or administrator independently of these regulations.

8. A minor who is a member of any such Expeditionary Force may grant to any person or body corporate a power of attorney in the same manner and for the same purposes, and with the same force and effect, as if he was of full age, save that nothing done under any such power of attorney while the grantor remains a minor shall have any greater or other force or effect than if it had been done by the minor himself.
