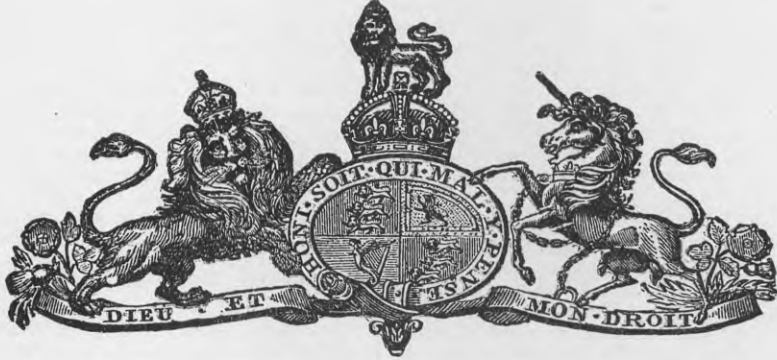

SPECIAL INQUIRY.

GISBORNE.—Body of unknown man found in the Tauranganui River: The following further description of the body has been supplied by the Gisborne police: Age about sixty-five, height about 5 ft. 6 in., labourer, stout build, sandy hair and beard tinged with grey, blue eyes, short nose, full face; dressed in grey-tweed waistcoat and trousers, blue- serge coat, blue linen shirt, merino underpants, strong heavy nailed boots, and dark-tweed overcoat. (See *Police Gazette*, 1916, page 769.) (C.R. 16/15.) This is in lieu of the paragraph appearing on page 29 of this *Gazette*, where the reference given is incorrect.

PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—30th September last, on **warrant** for theft of £15 16s., the property of A. J. Entrican and Co., Custom Street West, **William L. Higgins**, age about twenty-seven, height about 5 ft. 7 in., traveller, native of New Zealand, medium build, fresh complexion, dark hair going bald, dark eyes; usually dressed in a striped blue suit, and black-beaver or straw hat; slightly knock-kneed; quick gait; larrikin appearance. Accused who was employed as city traveller received £15 16s. from Mrs. Cain, Victoria Street, on terms requiring him to account for the same to the firm of A. J. Entrican and Co., and fraudulently omitted so to do. There are other similar charges pending.

PORT AWANUI.—30th October last, on **warrant** of commitment to Wanganui Prison for three months in default of paying £75 13s. 6d. fine and costs for a breach of the Licensing Act, **W. J. England**, age about thirty-four, height about 5 ft. 11 in., shop-assistant, native of New Zealand, slight build, fair complexion, brown hair, clean-shaved; slight impediment in speech.

TAUMARUNUI.—15th instant, on **warrant** for theft of a gentlemen's bicycle, value £5 (recovered), the property of Bert Meyenberg, motor-engineer, **Ernest Brasting**, age nineteen, height 5 ft. 8 in., labourer and mill hand, native of New Zealand, medium build, fair hair and complexion, blue staring eyes, prominent front teeth, one leg (believed to be left one) shorter than the other; dressed in brown riding-breeches and leggings, dark coat, and slate-coloured-felt hat. Accused hired the bicycle and sold it for £1 10s.

NEW PLYMOUTH.—19th September last, that he may be compelled to maintain his child, **Edward Hugh Tibbitts**, age about twenty-eight, height about 5 ft. 8 in., station hand, native of England, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, right arm about 2 in. shorter than left one. Complainant, Mary Scanlon.

NAPIER.—Between the 1st ultimo and 5th instant, on **warrant** for false pretences, **Irwin Campbell**, age about twenty-nine, height about 5 ft. 8 in., runholder, strong build, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, brown eyes, clean-shaved, heavy eyebrows, round shoulders, scar on forehead, needle-injection holes in one forearm; dressed in vest, breeches and leggings, blue coat and vest, or light-grey suit and cap. M. Campbell, of Havelock North, was his cousin. There are other charges pending.

NAPIER.—11th November last, that a summons for a breach of the Sale of Food and Drugs Act may be served upon him, **Sydney Warner**, age thirty, height 5 ft. 7 in., refreshment-room keeper, native of New Zealand, slight build, sallow complexion, dark hair, small dark moustache; usually dressed in a dark suit and straw hat. He may be accompanied by his wife.

OTAKI.—1st ultimo, on **warrant** of commitment to Wellington Prison for one month in default of paying £6 12s. 6d. fine and costs for furiously driving a motor-bicycle, **Tamati Hohepa**, age about twenty, height about 5 ft. 7 in., labourer, native of New Zealand, medium build, copper complexion, black hair, brown eyes; usually dressed in a dark suit, and black soft-felt hat or cap; a half-caste Maori; erect gait; quiet manner.

WELLINGTON.—5th instant, that a summons for a breach of his prohibition order may be served upon him, **Arthur Morris**, age twenty-eight, height 5 ft. 9 in., miner and billiard-marker, native of New Zealand, strong build, fresh complexion, brown hair, grey eyes, left eye and right hand missing. WELLINGTON.—18th instant, that a notice of issue of a prohibition order may be served upon her, **Annie Marryatt**, age forty-five, height 5 ft. 6 in., native of New Zealand, medium build, fresh complexion, brown hair, blue eyes; usually well dressed.

BLENHEIM.—15th instant, that he may be located and induced to maintain his wife, who is destitute in England, **Frank Hawtin**, age thirty, height 5 ft. 8 in., labourer and carpenter, native of England, fresh complexion, dark hair, brown eyes; 10½ st. weight. His photograph is filed in the Superintendent's Office, Wellington. Inquiry is at the instance of Ethel Mary Hawtin, Little Tew, Enstone, Oxon, England.

BLACKBALL.—7th instant, that two summonses for breaches of the Licensing Act may be served upon him, **George Freil**, age twenty-five, height 5 ft. 8 in., labourer and miner, native of Ireland, medium build, florid complexion, dark-brown hair, grey eyes, clean-shaved; usually dressed in a blue-serge or brownish-tweed suit and grey cap.

MURCHISON.—15th instant, that a notice under section 35 of the Military Service Act may be served upon him, **Jack O'Keefe**, age about forty-three, height about 5 ft. 8 in., labourer and miner, native of New Zealand, dark complexion, hair, and moustache; speaks with an Irish accent.

CHRISTCHURCH.—20th ultimo, on **warrant** of commitment to Lyttelton Prison for fourteen days in default of paying £2 fine and costs for driving a vehicle at excessive speed, **William Tennent**, age twenty-three, height 5 ft. 5 in., motor mechanic, native of New Zealand, slight build, fair complexion, light-brown hair and eyes, clean-shaved, thin face.

METHVEN.—19th ultimo, on **warrant** of commitment to Lyttelton Prison for six weeks in default of paying £16 9s., arrears due on a maintenance order for the support of J. J. Grace, **Thomas Grace**, age twenty-four, height 5 ft. 5 in., farm labourer, native of New Zealand, strong build, fresh complexion, curly dark-brown hair, grey eyes; usually dressed in a dark suit, white straw hat, and black lace-up boots; abrupt insolent manner; hangs head when walking. Certain Land in New River Hundred declared a Sanctuary for Imported and Native Game.

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto, the property of Mrs. S. Beavan, of Oporo, shall be a sanctuary for the purposes of the said Animals Protection Act, and that no imported game or native game shall be taken within the said area.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Southland Land District, being Section 11, Block XIV, New River Hundred, bounded towards the north and west by the Oreti River, towards the south by a public road, and towards the east by Section 10.

Also all that area, being Sections 20, 21, 30, and part of a road, bounded towards the north by Section 31, towards the west by a public road, again towards the north by a public road, towards the east by the Oreti River, towards the south by Sections 22 and 29, and towards the west by Section 43.

As witness the hand of His Excellency the Governor, this eleventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen.
