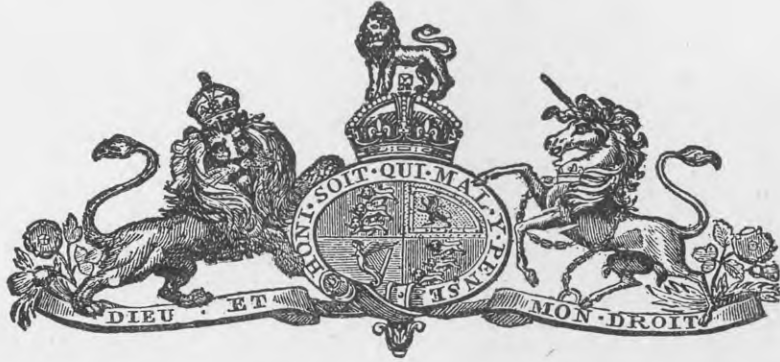

SPECIAL INQUIRY.

WAIROA.—On the 8th ultimo Henry H. Mortensen found the body of a newly-born male half-caste child floating in the Wairoa River; it was in a pillow-slip with "J. Dickson, Wairoa Hotel," on it. A post-mortem examination of the body revealed the fact that the child had breathed for a short period, and at an inquest the jury found that the cause of death was neglect at birth. Kabu Pomare, is suspected as being the mother of the child. She has been interviewed by the police and examined by Dr. Hall Wright, but no implicative evidence was obtained. Description: Age twenty-three, height 5 ft. 6 in., domestic, native of New Zealand, stout build, dark complexion, black hair, brown almond-shaped eyes; usually laughs when spoken to; a half-cast Maori. Any information regarding this matter is to be communicated to the Inspector of Police, Napier.

PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—Between the 19th and 30th July last, on **warrant** for theft of a copper boiler and a cast-iron pot, total value £3, the property of W. F. Censorship of Cinematograph films.

With reference to the regulations under the Cinematograph film Censorship Act, 1916, published in *Police Gazette* 1916, pages 664-666, the Crown Law Office advises that clause 12 of the regulations, which requires that a copy of the Censor's certificate of approval be screened with each film, is *ultra vires*. It is therefore not an offence to exhibit a censored film without the Censor's certificate attached.

When a film is exhibited without such certificate, the proprietor should be asked to produce the Censor's certificate of approval, and, if he is unable to do so, inquiry should be made by telegraph from the Under-Secretary, Internal Affairs Department, whether the film has been censored. If it has not been censored, then proceedings should be taken for an offence against section 7 of the Act. In any such prosecution it may be anticipated that the accused will admit that the film had not been censored, for if he refused to make such admission the only result would be an adjournment of the case in order to obtain the evidence of the Censor, and the heavy costs so incurred would fall upon the accused.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this seventeenth day of September, 1917.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the fifth section of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor-General in Council may from time to time make regulations, which shall have general force and effect throughout the Dominion or particular force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein, for, amongst other things, prescribing conditions and restrictions for the regulating of fishing and the taking of fish, and for prohibiting the use of any particular engines, tackles, or apparatus for taking any fish:

And whereas it is desirable to prohibit the taking of fish by trawling and the use of trawl-nets in those portions of the sea defined in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall haul or use a trawl-net for the purpose of taking fish in those portions of the sea as described in the Schedule hereto.

2. Any person committing a breach of clause 1 of these regulations is liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

SCHEDULE.

Bon Accord Harbour, Kawau Island.—Inside a straight line from Accord Point to Momona Point, as shown in red on plan marked M.D. 4836, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

Port Abercrombie, Great Barrier Island.—Inside a straight line from the westerly point of Green Island to Wellington Head, as shown in red on plan marked M.D. 4837, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

Port Fitzroy, Great Barrier Island.—Inside a straight line from the mainland to Selwyn Island across the narrowest part of Governor's Pass, as shown in red on plan marked M.D. 4837, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

Altering Regulations for Trout and Perch Fishing in the Wellington Acclimatization District.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted in Part II of the Fisheries Act, 1908, that the Governor-General in Council may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations to have force and effect throughout New Zealand, or only in such waters or places as are specified in the regulations

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 110, of the twenty-eighth day of the same month, regulations for the Wellington Acclimatization District were made, providing, *inter alia*, that no lures or baits other than artificial fly or artificial minnow shall be used in any of the rivers or streams set forth in the proviso to clause five of the said regulations:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke such regulations and proviso, and make fresh provisions in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the said Order in Council of the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen; and doth also hereby revoke the proviso to clause five of the said regulations of the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and substitute the following proviso in lieu thereof:—

Provided that no lures or baits other than artificial ones shall be used in the following rivers and streams and their tributaries: The Wainuiomata, the Wainui tributary of the Whakatiki, the Mungaroa, the Korokoro, the Akatarawa, and the Little Akatarawa (Hutt County); the South Karori, the Porirua, the Kaiwarra (Makara County); the Mangaone, the Waitohu, the Waikawa, the Waikanae above Buchanan's house, the Tokomaru, the Makaretu, the Makahiki (tributaries of the Ohau); the Ohau above the railway bridge (Horowhenua County); the Mangatarera (Wairarapa); the Kahutarawa, the Tiritea (Kairanga County); the Makakahi from its source to the bridge at Newman (Eketahuna County); and the Hautapu from Jacobsen's Bridge, north of Taihape, southwards (Rangitikei County).

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section eighty-three of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following additional general regulation for the purposes of the said Act.

REGULATION.

ANY acclimatization society may, with the approval of the Minister of Marine, prohibit the use of torches for eel-fishing in any river within its district.
