

## SPECIAL INQUIRY.

Palmerston North.—Inquiries are requested to establish the identity of a Man (name unknown), whose dead body was found on the 20th instant in an advanced stage of decomposition in the Manawatu River. Description: Age about thirty-five, height about 5 ft. 6 in., good build, fair or brown moustache, full set of artificial teeth in each jaw, tooth next to and at back of right eye-tooth missing; dressed in brown-tweed trousers, with blue and green stripes ("Manifold, Pahiatua," on one button), dark waist-coat, green braces, ornamented with horse-shoes, gray-flannel singlet, heavy grey woollen underpants, black cashmere socks, white cotton shirt, and strong lace-up tan boots with large brass eye-holes, size about 8. The body presented the appearance of having been in the water about two months. Any information regarding the identification of the man is to be sent to the Inspector of Police, Wanganui.

Paparua Prison proclaimed.

## LIVERPOOL, Governor-General. A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled the Prisons Act, 1908, it is provided that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation published i the Gazette, declare any house, building, enclosure, or place to be a prison, and from and after the gazetting of any such Proclamation, or from any later time specified in the Proclamation, such house, building, enclosure, or place shall be deemed a prison:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the above-recited power and authority, do hereby declare that the buildings erected upon the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and all enclosures used or occupied therewith, shall, from and after the publication of this Proclamation in the Gazette, be a prison, known as the Paparua Prison, within the meaning and for the purposes of the Prisons Act, 1908.
