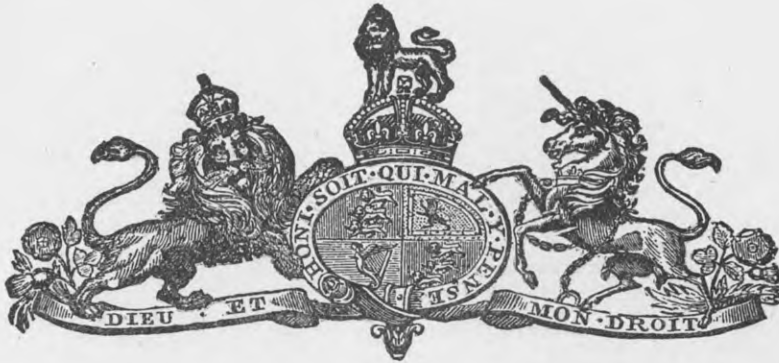

A PROCLAMATION.
