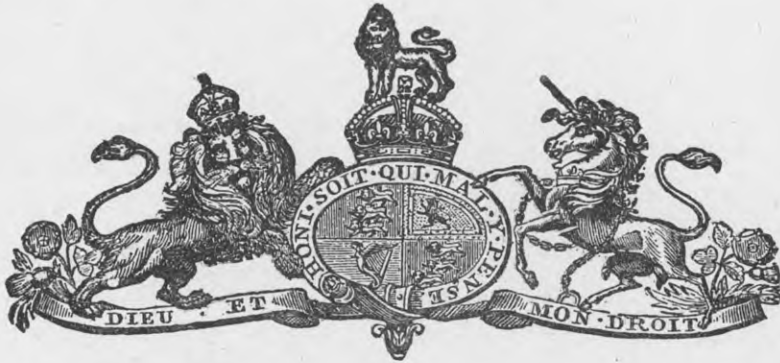

Identifiable. The watches were pillaged from insured parcels addressed "F. Sladen, jeweller, Christchurch," and "Care of National Bank, Christchurch."
