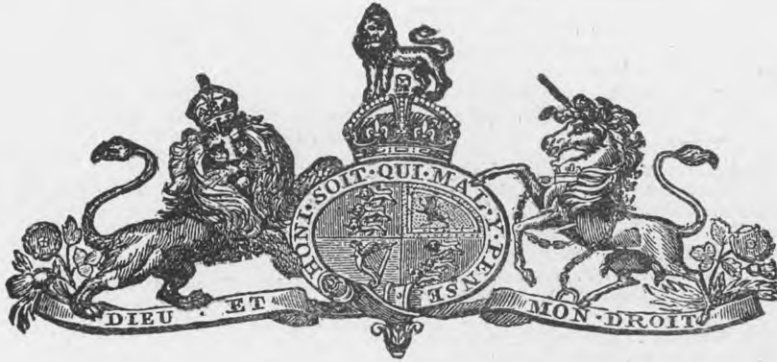

When any man is so detained an urgent telegram giving as full particulars as possible is to be sent immediately to the Government Statistician inquiring as to the man's military status. Particular care should be taken to give full Christian and surnames, and to see that they are correctly spelt.
