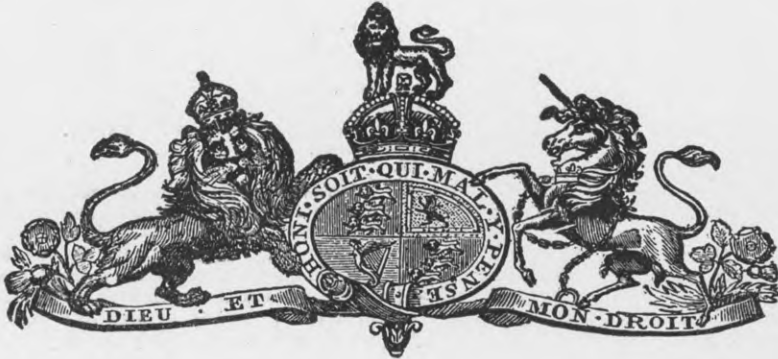

Winton**, age twenty-seven, height 5 ft. 7½ in., labourer, native of New Zealand, good build, fresh tanned complexion, dark-brown hair, blue eyes; dressed in a grey suit, light-grey-tweed overcoat, and carries a walking-stick; erect gait; smart appearance; talks in a fluent convincing manner. Accused obtained lodging for a night from Albert Owen Casey, of the Foresters' Arms Hotel, by means of a valueless cheque on the Bank of New South Wales, Wellington. (See *Police Gazette*, 1917, page 723, and Photographs, 1913, page 37, and following paragraph.)

WELLINGTON.—11th instant, on warrant for false pretences, **F. W. Winton** (name probably fictitious), age about twenty-seven, height 5 ft. 7½ in., labourer, native of New Zealand, good build, fresh sunburnt complexion, dark-brown hair, blue eyes; usually well dressed in a dark-brown suit and brown cap or soft hat, but may be dressed in knickerbockers and brown cap; talks in a fluent, convincing manner; erect gait; smart appearance. Accused obtained goods value £4 3s. and £1 7s. in money from George Edwin Potter, boot-importer, 70 Lambton Quay, by means of a valueless cheque for £5 10s. The photograph of **Joseph Thomas Christie**, in *Police Gazette*, 1913, page 37, has been identified as that of accused. He also stole a Harley-Davidson motor-bicycle, No. W.N. 1519, chocolate colour. He may be identical with **Joseph Thomas Christie**, referred to in *Police Gazette*, 1917, page 723, and with **E. W. Winton**, *Police Gazette*, 1918, page 42. There are other charges pending. (See preceding paragraph.)

WELLINGTON.—21st November last, that a summons for obtaining liquor, being under the age of twenty-one years, may be served upon him, **Sydney Walter Keatch**, age eighteen, height 5 ft. 3 in., hotel porter, native of New Zealand, dark-brown hair, brown eyes; usually dressed in a navy-blue-serge suit and black-felt hat; neat appearance.

Restricting Shooting Season for Paradise Duck.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify that paradise duck (*Casarca variegata*), a bird indigenous to the said Dominion of New Zealand, may be taken or killed in the Otago Acclimatization District and in the Southland Acclimatization District for a period of one month from the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, to the thirty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, both days inclusive:

Provided that the number of the said paradise duck which may be taken or killed in the said acclimatization districts by any one person in any one day during the said period shall not exceed twenty birds.

As witness the hand of His Excellency the Governor-General, this ninth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Northern Wairoa Racing Club at a meeting held on the 7th day of December, 1917, at Dargaville, with a recommendation by the Chairman of the Club, Mr. Dargaville, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by the Governor-General, in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. F. J. Dargaville, the Chairman of the Club and the Meeting, moved, and Mr. W. B. Giesen seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

NORTHERN WAIROA RACING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Northern Wairoa Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the

said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the reserve situate at Awakino, Dargaville, set apart for racing purposes, and known as Awakino Racecourse, as the same is described in the Gaming Act, 1910, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

2. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the part of the said Awakino Reserve while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely,—

(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference.

(c.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
