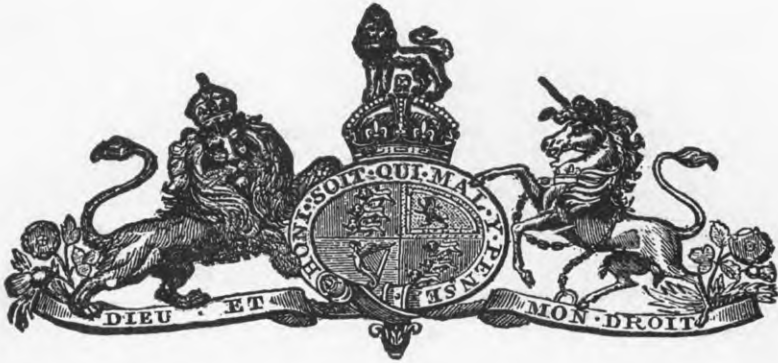

PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—**Bernard Faber, alias Smith**, obscene language, is now serving a sentence of three months in Sydney for theft from the person. (See *Police Gazette*, 1914, page 777.) (C.R. 11/115.)

WOODVILLE.—18th ultimo, on **warrant** for forgery and uttering, **Sydney Mexted**, age thirty-four, height 5 ft. 11 in., native of New Zealand, good build, fair complexion; dressed in riding-breeches and leggings or putties, navy-blue coat and vest, and Panama hat. Accused forged his father's signature ("Jesse Mexted") to a cheque for £10 10s., and uttered it to Frank Martin Kenney, jeweller, in payment of £5, for a silver hunting lever watch, No. 302762. He is in possession of his father's cheque-book on the Bank of New Zealand, Dannevirke, Nos. 73441 to 73464. There are other charges pending.

HASTINGS.—21st October last, on **warrant** for false-preferences, **Franklin John Smith**, age twenty-two, height 5 ft. 6 in., showman, native of New Zealand, medium build, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, hazel eyes. Accused obtained £13 from Patrick Joseph Charles Lloyd, teller, Bank of New South Wales, Hastings, by falsely representing that he had £20 in that bank at Auckland. The photograph of **Frank Smith** in *Police Gazette*, 1915, page 56, has been identified as that of accused. (See *Police Gazette*, 1916, pages 228 and 591.)

WANGANUI.—26th July last, that he may be compelled to maintain his wife, an inmate of Porirua Mental Hospital, **Francis Sorrell Smith** (known as **Pompy Smith**), age about forty-six, height 5 ft. 6½ in., labourer and pawnbroker, native of England, good build, dark-brown hair going bald, decayed prominent teeth, prominent chin, thin face, clean-shaved; usually dressed in a grey suit and cap or felt hat; untidy appearance. He was discharged from Featherston Camp on 20th May last.

WANGANUI.—2nd instant, on **warrant** for failing to comply with the terms of a maintenance order for the support of his wife, Florence Ruth Frances Dorothy Roy, and two children, **Alfred Franklyn Roy**, age forty-nine, height 5 ft. 8 in., sailmaker and lineman, native of England, medium build, sallow complexion, curly black hair, dark eyes, tattooed on arms, small brown moustache, wrinkled face; usually dressed in a grey suit and black hard hat; stooped shoulders; fond of drink. The following extracts from a report received from Colonel T. W. Porter, C.B., Inspector of Recruiting Services (Defence Department), is published for the information of members of the Force.

J. O'DONOVAN,
Commissioner of Police.

"Last month I completed a duty tour of the whole Dominion, and visited (in addition to defence) all the police districts, sub-districts, and many of the lesser stations."

"In every part I received the readiest attention and assistance from all your officers, Superintendents, Inspectors, Sub-Inspectors, and others in charge of stations.

I feel personally gratified to say there was no hesitation in trusting and affording me every information confidentially required, and so treated by me. Part of my duties also brought me in contact with the Detective Branch, from which I received every information and attention to reports, and I was enabled to render them assistance on many occasions."

"I found the requirements of the Military Service Acts and regulations entailed a vast amount of extra work and responsibility upon the police, outside of their many civil duties, also largely increased by the war conditions."

"My duties necessitated me after dealing with defence records (particularly military warrants) to compare those of the Police Department, to ascertain actions taken and check existing discrepancies as to the numbers of unexecuted warrants, &c. In the keeping and system of records, with slight exceptions, I found the police the most reliable, no doubt owing to the long training and discipline. In connection with this I was enabled to bring about a better system of co-ordination and co-operation between the Departments."

"I am able from my past experience and insight now obtained to testify to the excellent efficiency and discipline of the Police Department."

"Concluding, I beg to thank yourself and officers for the courtesy and ready assistance afforded me."

Photographing of Oversea Ships.
