Industrial Schools.

During the past two years extensive changes have been made in the industrial-school system and in the system generally of dealing with dependent and delinquent children. In place of the institution system the Department has adopted the policy, wherever possible, of placing children who have been dealt with by the Courts either on probation with relatives under the supervision of the Juvenile Probation Officers or in foster-homes in country districts under the supervision of Lady Boarding-out Officers or lady officials of the various Receiving Homes. In many cases short periods of detention are desirable, and for this purpose the children in question are admitted either to Probation Homes or Receiving Homes for periods varying up to three months. For children who for various reasons are not amenable to the milder discipline of the average country foster-home and who require longer periods of training than can be given at a Probation or Receiving Home admission to a residential institution is arranged, but even these cases are reviewed every six months with the object of placing them out under supervision in approved homes or in situations as soon as it is considered that they are fit to associate with normal children. A review of the characteristics of all the boys and girls detained in residential institutions and a judicious application of the probation system has resulted in the placing-out of over eight hundred boys and girls who had been in residence for periods of years. The reduction in the number of children in residence has resulted in the closing of the Burnham Industrial School (for boys) and of Te Oranga Home (for girls) at Christchurch. The reorganization of the system dealing with girls and young children may now be regarded as completed.

A property in New Street, Ponsonby, has been secured for the purpose of a Receiving Home for girls and young children, and will be gazetted as such in the beginning of April. The home is intended to cater for all girls up to sixteen years of age and children (boys and girls) fit for boarding out with ordinary families throughout the whole of the Auckland District.

The Wellington Receiving Home provides for similar cases dealt with in the Taranaki, Hawke's Bay, Wellington, Marlborough, Nelson, and the West Coast districts as far south as Reefton. A Lady Officer of the Wellington Receiving Home has been stationed at Wanganui (telegraphic address, "Boarding, Wanganui"), who should be advised of all children committed to industrial schools from the Taranaki and Wanganui districts as far south as Marton. Another Lady Officer is stationed in Nelson (telegraphic address, "Boarding, Nelson"), and she should be advised of any children committed to the Wellington Receiving Home from Marlborough, Nelson, or West Coast districts as far south as Reefton. It is proposed also to appoint from the 1st April a Lady Officer with headquarters at Napier who should take charge of all children committed to the Receiving Home from Hawke's Bay as far south as Woodville. Her telegraphic address will be "Boarding, Napier." It is hoped that the police will utilize the services of these Lady Officers

as far as possible for inquiries regarding the homes, relatives, or the conduct of any young children brought up under the provisions of section 17 of the Industrial Schools Act and for inquiry regarding applications for adoptions.

The Christchurch Receiving Home provides for girls and children of school age (boys and girls) committed from Canterbury to Kaitiaki in the north and the Waitaki in the south, also the West Coast south of Reefton.

The Caversham Industrial School caters for elder girls, children of school age, and, until a Boys' Probation Home is established in Dunedin, for all boys of school age from Otago and Southland.

With regard to boys, the Boys' Training Farm at Weraroa has been reserved for boys over fourteen years of age, and the Boys' Training Farm, Nelson, for boys under fourteen years of age who are not suitable for boarding out or for short periods of detention at Probation Homes.

The Department is about to establish the institution at present known as the Industrial School at Mount Albert, Auckland, as a Probation Home for boys, and also as an industrial school for boys under fourteen years of age.

Probation Homes have been established at Wellington and Christchurch for boys under fourteen years, and an Assistant Probation Officer is now stationed at Timaru. The Juvenile Probation Officers in each of the four centres (Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin), and the Assistant Probation Officer at Timaru, are authorized to take charge of boys of all ages who are brought within the scope of the Industrial Schools Act.

It is desirable that, as far as possible, children should be committed to the nearest suitable school, and where families are dealt with that all the children should be committed to the one school in order that, as far as possible, the family ties may be preserved. For instance, children of the same family residing in, say, New Plymouth or Napier should be committed to the Wellington Receiving Home, and the local Lady Boarding-out Officers advised. Boys of school age from, say, Masterton or Palmerston should be committed either to the Receiving Home or to the Probation Home in Wellington, and the Manager or the Probation Officer advised immediately by telegraph. Boys of school age from Invercargill should be committed to the Caversham Industrial School. Boys over fourteen years from the same district should be committed to the Boys' Training Farm, Weraroa, but the Probation Officer in Dunedin (telegraphic address, "Probation, Dunedin") should be advised. In the case of boys over fourteen years committed from Canterbury either the Assistant Probation Officer at Timaru or the Probation Officer in Christchurch should be advised by telegraph. The Probation Officer in Wellington should be advised by telephone of all boys passing through Wellington en route to any school.

The Department would be much obliged if you could see your way to ensure that when children are committed to industrial schools orders are applied for (where financial circumstances permit) by your officers for their maintenance from all relations liable to contribute up to 10s. a week, as from the date of committal, without waiting until the Department has requested them to take action. This routine is carefully followed at some police-stations, but it is not a general rule.

Special Regulations for Deer-shooting, Waitaki.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the conditions under which certain red deer may be destroyed in the Waitaki Acclimatization District.

REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, dated 13th February, 1919, the Secretary of the Waitaki Acclimatization Society of Oamaru, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such Secretary, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill red deer of either sex and of any age which, in the opinion of the said Secretary or of the said authorized persons, should be destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or other physical imperfection.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from the date hereof to 31st December, 1919.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said Secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates and name of person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. The said Secretary may, with the authority of the said society, authorize the sale, either by auction or otherwise, during the currency of these regulations of deer destroyed pursuant to these regulations, and of the meat and skins of such deer; provided that the proceeds derived from such sale shall be devoted to patriotic purposes.

4A. The said Secretary shall, on or before the 31st day of January, 1920, furnish a statement of the moneys received from such sale and of the patriotic purpose or purposes to which they were devoted.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, dated 13th February, 1919, the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatization Society at Dunedin, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such Secretary, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill red deer of either sex and of any age which, in the opinion of the said Secretary or of the said authorized persons, should be destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or other physical imperfection.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from the date hereof to 31st December, 1919.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said Secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates and name of person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. Revoking and cancelling Permits for Collections, receiving or raising Moneys for War Funds.

Department of Internal Affairs,

Wellington, 27th February, 1919.

OWING to the cessation of hostilities and the early return of the New Zealand Forces, the necessity for raising further money for certain War Funds no longer exists.

In pursuance of section 33, subsection (6), of the War Legislation Act, 1917, all existing permits to raise money on behalf of the societies controlling the following War Funds are hereby revoked and cancelled:—

Blue Cross Fund.

Catholic Federation Field Service Fund.

Chaplains and Nurses Fund.

Church of England Military Affairs Committee.

Equipment Gifts and Parcels for Soldiers and Sailors.

Methodist Church Military Camps Committee.

Mine Sweepers.

Navy League Ladies Auxiliary.

Presbyterian Church Chaplains and Camp Funds.

Prisoners of War Fund.

Red Cross Fund.

Sewing and Knitting Guilds.

Salvation Army War Fund.

Trench Comforts Fund.

Tobacco Funds for Overseas.

Women's National Reserve Fund.

Y.M.C.A. War Fund.

Should the Executive of any of the above funds desire to make a special appeal for a particular purpose, full consideration will be given on application being made.

All permits for patriotic shops are hereby revoked and cancelled, unless specially approved for the augmentation of funds controlled by patriotic societies empowered to grant relief and assistance to soldiers and dependants.

Generally the issue of further permits should be restricted to the raising of funds to be expended by incorporated societies and those administering funds for the direct benefit of soldiers and dependants.

As this arrangement will tend to materially decrease the number of permits, the monthly returns of permits issued hitherto supplied to the War Funds Office by Mayors, Chairmen of local bodies, and other persons authorized may be discontinued. In the absence of a return it will be assumed that no permits whatever have been issued, but it is desirable in order to supervise collections that notification should be given in every case where permits are granted.

Where any doubt exists as to whether a particular permit should be issued, a collect telegram to the Department will receive prompt attention.

RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Stratford Racing Club at a meeting held on the 30th December, 1918, at Stratford, with a recommendation by the Chairman of the Club, Mr. W. J. Morrison, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by the Governor-General, in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. W. J. Morrison, the Chairman of the Club and the Meeting, moved, and Mr. D. J. Malone seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

STRATFORD RACING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Stratford Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 17th day of November, 1915, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to Lots 7, 8, 9, and 10 of Section 6, and Lots 11 and 12 of Sections 6, 7, and 8, and part 2 of Sections 3, 4, and 5, all in Block 11, situate in the district of Ngaire, and known as the Stratford Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.
2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.
3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely,—
 - (a.) Bookmakers.
 - (b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.
 - (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.
 - (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908; and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

The foregoing regulations of the Stratford Racing Club were made and passed by the Stratford Racing Club on the 30th day of December, 1918, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
