EXTRACTS FROM NEW ZEALAND GAZETTE.

RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Wellington Trotting Club at a meeting held on the 4th day of January, 1919, at Petone, with a recommendation by the Chairman of the Club, Dr. M. Ross, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by the Governor-General, in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Dr. M. Ross, the Chairman of the Club and the Meeting, moved, and Mr. R. A. Armstrong seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to :-

WELLINGTON TROTTING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf con-The pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Wellington Trotting Club, a trotting club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 15th day of September, 1917, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Hutt Park situated in the District of Hutt, and known as the Hutt Park Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.
