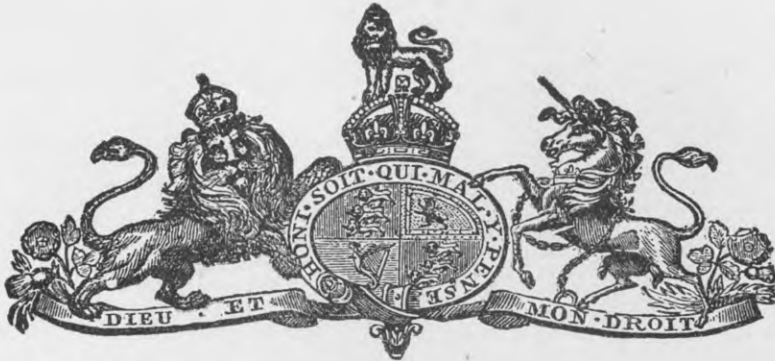

PERSONS WANTED.

MAUNGATUROTO.—13th August last, on **warrant** for false pretences, **George Benfell**, age fifty-five, height 5 ft. 9 in., labourer, native of New Zealand, slight build, dark hair and complexion, black whiskers. EXTRACTS FROM NEW ZEALAND GAZETTE.

(From *New Zealand Gazette*, 1919, pages 190-192.)

RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Wellington Trotting Club at a meeting held on the 4th day of January, 1919, at Petone, with a recommendation by the Chairman of the Club, Dr. M. Ross, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by the Governor-General, in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Dr. M. Ross, the Chairman of the Club and the Meeting, moved, and Mr. R. A. Armstrong seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

WELLINGTON TROTTING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)
