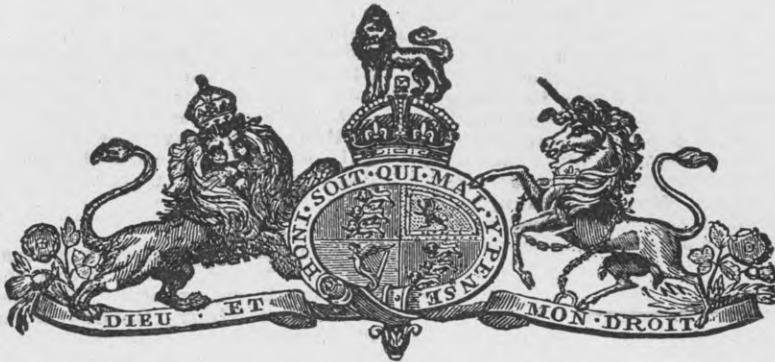

## SPECIAL INQUIRY.



CHRISTCHURCH.—Special inquiries are requested for **Kyra Margaret Davis** (whose photograph appears alongside), born May, 1912, tall for age, very fair hair (getting darker), large blue eyes, two lower front teeth missing. She was in a foster-home at Christchurch, and was called **Betty** by her foster-mother, was in Primer 4 at a private school in December last, and had become thinner since the photograph was taken at five years and a half. On the 24th December last the advertisement photographed below appeared in the *Auckland Herald*, and the girl's mother, who lived in Auckland, wishing to have the child adopted and get married, answered it, and a day or two later received a telegram, "Arriving to-night from Frankton Junction," signed Gordon, Frankton. She and **Gordon** met, the adoption was agreed on, and she went to Christchurch and brought the girl to Wellington, where she was met by **Gordon**, who took them to Barrett's Hotel, where he had arrived on the 4th January last. As solicitors' offices were closed he persuaded her to part with the girl without legal adoption, and she returned to Auckland on the 7th January last, leaving him and the child in Wellington, and since then inquiries have failed to trace them. He paid her £20 for expenses and the outfit of the child, remarking that a cheque would trace him, and she thinks the notes were on the Bank of Australasia or the Union Bank of Australia. She also

gathered that **Gordon** was an assumed name, as he declined to give her his name and address, and would not permit her to include him when she was taking a snapshot photograph of the child. Description: **Gordon** (name probably fictitious), age about thirty-nine, height about 5 ft. 8 in., good build, brown hair, blue eyes; dressed in a navy-blue suit, fawn-coloured overcoat, a soft Stetson hat, and wore pince-nez; well spoken, and apparently educated and professed to be well-to-do. He said he had been a schoolmaster, and had travelled, and would do so again as soon as the war was over, and that his wife was an invalid and depressed through the recent death of their three-year-old girl. **All members of the Force in charge of stations** are instructed to make the fullest inquiries before the Christmas vacation at all public and private schools, at all banks, particularly those mentioned, with a view to tracing the man by the handwriting, description, &c.; also respecting all persons named **White, Gordon, or McGordon**, and any persons of such Christian names, or any person of any name who may be indicated by the particulars supplied.
