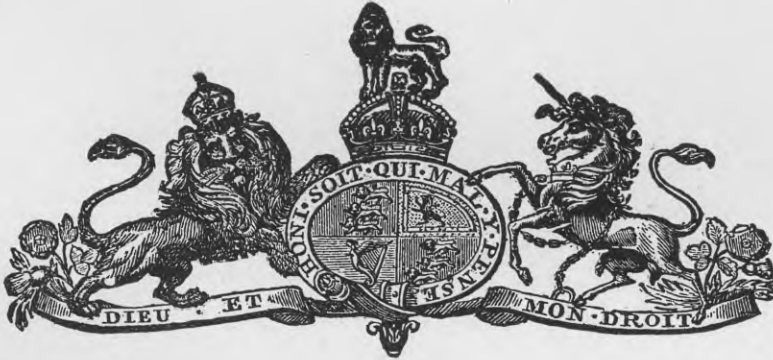

## SPECIAL NOTICES.

**TARANAKI STREET (WELLINGTON).**—About 9.20 p.m. on the 30th May last three plate-glass windows, value £180, in the premises of John Chambers and Sons, warehousemen, Cable Street, were wilfully broken. Any information regarding the offence is to be communicated to the Superintendent of Police, Wellington.
