*Declaring certain Area in the Hawera Acclimatization District to be a Sanctuary for Imported and Native Game.*

ROBERT STOUT.

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Robert Stout, the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be a sanctuary for the purposes of the Animals Protection Act, and that no imported or native game shall be taken or killed within the said area.

#### SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Hawera Acclimatization District, situated in Blocks XII and XVI, Ngairu Survey District, and in Blocks IX and XIII, Omona Survey District, being the properties of Robertson Brothers, trustees of late A. Hatrick and W. Hardwick-Smith.
