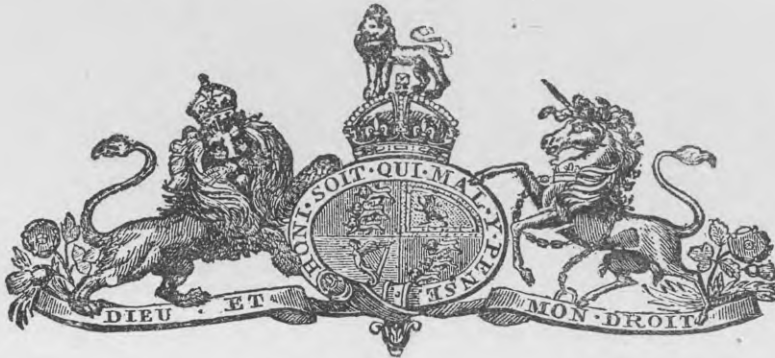

## PERSONS WANTED.

**DEVONPORT.**—20th instant, that he may be compelled to pay £82 5s. 4d. arrears due for the maintenance of his two sons, Alexander and Cyril McDonald, inmates of St. Mary's Industrial School, **Alexander McDonald**, age forty-five, height about 5 ft. 5 in., painter, native of Scotland, medium build, brown hair turning grey, grey eyes, long nose, light-brown moustache, thin features; dressed in a dark-grey suit and soft-felt hat; fond of drink.

Hume, of Featherston, and that his motor-driver would call for the coat. He is identical with **George Alison**, referred to in *Police Gazette*, 1919, page 632, and preceding paragraph.
