Transmission of Court Moneys by Post.

With reference to the collection by the police of moneys from defendants in satisfaction of fines, Court costs, &c., at places other than where the Clerk of Court is resident, arrangements have now been made with the Justice and Postal Departments for the issue of money-orders free of commission for the purpose of transmitting such moneys by post to the Clerk of the Court, and so avoid sending the amounts in cash.

Whenever, therefore, it is necessary to forward such moneys by post, a money-order should be obtained in favour of the Clerk of the Court at which the money is payable, and forwarded to him through the usual channel. When application is made for such money-order, the Postmaster should be informed that it is required in terms of this circular.
