

N OTICE.—For instructions as to the manner in which reports are required to be furnished for the compilation of the *Police Gazette* see *Gazette* No. 1 of this year.

The arrest of offenders described in the *Police Gazette*, or respecting whom crime reports have been forwarded for insertion in the *Gazette*, should be promptly notified by the members of the Force effecting the arrest.

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with theft or suspected of theft, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property supposed to be stolen, found n the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, shall be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

All communications concerning this Gazette should be addressed to the Commissioner of Police, Wellington, and the envelope marked "For Gazette." Members of the Force in charge of out-stations will forward them *direct*.

#### SPECIAL INQUIRY.

WELLINGTON.—Special inquiries are to be made with a view to establishing the parentage of a male child whose body was found floating in the Wellington Harbour, near Kaiwarra. Medical testimony shows that the body was that of a newly born child; the skull was fractured, and the brain lacerated. There is no doubt that the child was born alive, and that the injuries inflicted were caused while alive. At an adjourned inquest held on the 26th ultimo the following verdict was returned: "Deceased died at Wellington on or about the 3rd day of February, 1921, from a fractured skull. There is no evidence to show how or by whom such injury was inflicted upon deceased." Any information regarding this matter is to be communicated to the Superintendent of Police, Wellington.



#### Court Proceedings-Civil Cases.

With reference to Regulations Nos. 162 and 163, it is

With reference to Kegulations Nos. 162 and 163, it is hereby directed that when any member of the Force becomes involved in civil litigation, either as plaintiff or defendant, he shall immediately report the fact to the officer in charge of the district, and state the nature of such litigation. Any member of the Force summoned as a witness in a civil case of any description shall report similarly, and state the nature of the evidence he is likely to be called upon to give. No such member shall, without the authority of the officer in charge of the district. divulge in evidence any officer in charge of the district, divulge in evidence any information obtained by him in the course of his official

duties. No member of the Force shall without the like authority furnish any report or give any evidence or information required for any inquiry instituted by any other Government Department or local body, or any public or private corporation or firm.

#### EXTRACTS FROM NEW ZEALAND GAZETTE.

Prohibiting Trawling in Otago Harbour.

JELLICOE, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 1st day of February, 1921.

Present :

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE W. F. MASSEY, P.C., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the fifth section of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said act"), that the Governor-General in Council may from Act "). Act ), that the Governor-General in Council may from time to time make regulations, which shall have force and effect throughout New Zealand, or only in any waters or places specified therein, for, amongst other things, imposing conditions and restrictions on the taking of fish, and for prohibiting the use of any particular engines, tackles, or apparatus for taking any fish :

And whereas it is desirable to prohibit the taking of fish

by trawling and the use of trawl-nets in Otago Harbour: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers and anthorities enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regula-tions for the purposes of the said Act.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall haul or use a trawl-net for the purpose of taking fish in Otago Harbour inside a straight line drawn from the outermost point of Taiaroa Head Lighthouse to Hayward Point.

RED-DEER may be taken or killed within the Otago Acclimatization District, in the Hunter Valley, Dingle, Hawea Flat, and Makarora districts from the 1st day of April, 1921, to the 20th day of May, 1921 (both days inclusive), and in the Greenvale, Wart Hill, Upper Pomahaka, and Whitecomb districts from the 24th day of March, 1921, to the 13th day of May, 1921 (both days inclusive). 7. No person other than the license-holder, whether accompanying the license-holder or not, will be allowed to c rry a rifle on the shooting blocks during the season as authorized by these regulations.
