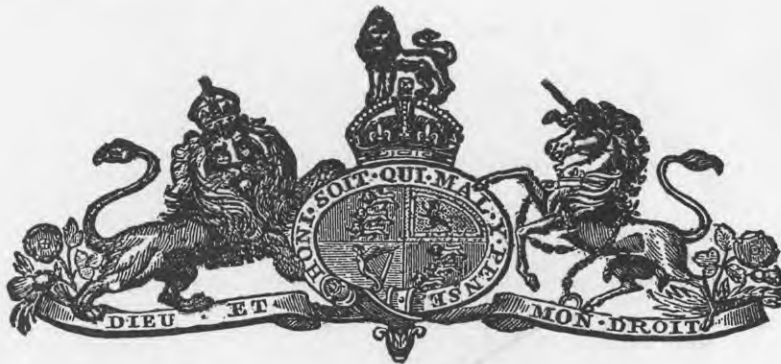

PERSONS WANTED.

NEWTON.—April last, on warrant for unlawful carnal knowledge of Winona Clark (age fourteen years and nine months), **Hector Augustus Hale**, age about nineteen, height about 5 ft. 5 in., labourer, native of New Zealand, medium build, fair hair and complexion; usually dressed in a blue-serge suit and straw hat.
