ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, being Sections 51 and 51A, Parish of Manurewa, part W. Johnstone's Beachlea Downs property.

Bounded towards the north-east by Section 7, Meadows Settlement, towards the south-east by the said Reserve 2593, towards the south-west by the Great South Railway Reserve, and towards the north-west by other parts of the said Sections 7458 and 8330.

Also all that area in the Canterbury Land District, containing by admeasurement 101 acres, more or less, and being a strip of land fifteen chains wide along the north-western side of Reserve 2593, known as the Washdyke Lagoon Sanctuary, and being parts of Sections 3, 5, and 7, Seaforth Settle-ment, situated in Block IX, Arowhenua Survey District.
