WELLINGTON.—The above are photographs of **John Foley**, alias **Gaunt**, alias **Wallace**, alias **Melrose**, who is believed to have left Western Australia for this Dominion some time last month. He is a most accomplished criminal, and has been

convicted at Sydney for burglary and being in possession of counterfeit bank-notes. He usually carries with him faked cards, dice, patent dice-boxes, and other instruments of gaming. At the time of his arrest on the charges mentioned he was found in possession of a complete outfit for printing totalizer tickets. As it is possible that he may forge such tickets in New Zealand special efforts are to be made to trace him, and should he be located an urgent communication is to be sent to the Commissioner of Police, Wellington. Description: Age forty-four, height 5 ft. 7½ in., labourer, native of Australia, stout build, dark-brown hair going bald, brown eyes.
