SPECIAL INQUIRY.

INVERCARGILL.—On the 5th instant some person or persons unknown entered the Ocean Beach Freezing-works, owned by J. G. Ward and Co., and destroyed 720 gallons of neat's-foot oil, value £206. A spanner ($\frac{1}{2}$ in. one end and $\frac{3}{16}$ in. other end) and a towel were stolen at the same time. Any information regarding the offence is to be communicated to the Inspector of Police, Invercargill.

Accused, who was in partnership with complainant, drew cheques on behalf of the firm, one of which was for £287 17s. 6d. He unlawfully converted a portion of the amount to his own use. He may be accompanied by his wife, and may endeavour to leave this Dominion.

AUCKLAND.—10th instant, that he may be located and informed that the Probation Officer, Auckland, requires him to comply with the conditions of his release upon probation (*Offenders Probation Act*, 1920), **Leonard Nelson**, age twenty-seven, height 5 ft. 11 in., driver, native of New Zealand, strong build, fresh complexion, light-brown hair, hazel eyes, two scars on left shin. He was convicted at Wellington on the 10th ultimo for theft (vide Police Gazette, 1922, page 468), but was not dealt with on above charge, the Wellington police not being then aware of the assault. Accused, who has a wife and four children, was employed as foreman carpenter by John Urquhart (father of the girl), builder, 40 Finch Street, Morningside, and on above date he took from her home without the consent of her parents with intent to carnally know her, Gladys Urquhart, an unmarried girl under the age of sixteen. They may endeavour to leave this Dominion. If located, care should be taken of the girl until she is returned to her parents. Description of Gladys Urquhart: Age fifteen years and three-quarters, height about 5 ft. 6 in., strong build, dark flesh complexion, dark hair which she wears up, round face; dressed in a white-silk blouse, dark-grey-flannel skirt, large black hat, black shoes and stockings, and nigger-brown overcoat; was carrying an embossed handbag with a kingfisher on outside, and wears a gold wristlet watch, with "Mother" on it.
