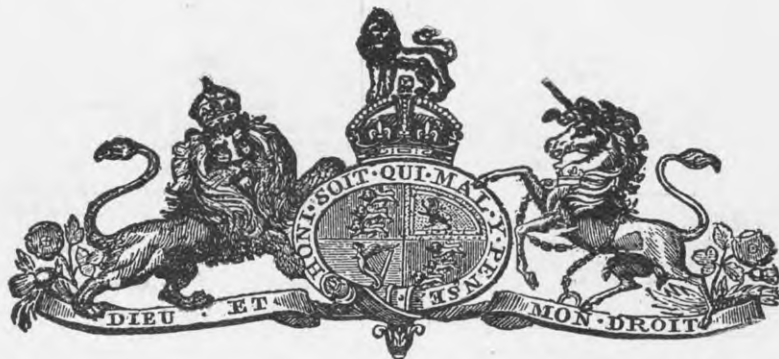

## SPECIAL NOTICE.

**TAIHAPE.**—Inquiries are to be made for the rifle, &c., described below, which were in the possession of John Edwin Brady, who was drowned in Lake Waikare on the 23rd April last, and which have disappeared since that date: A .45-calibre Winchester repeater rifle, No. 152250A; and a double-barrelled shot-gun, Nos. 42105 and 994, 12-gauge, maker H. Peiper.

## PERSONS WANTED.

**RAWENE.**—John Wilson, false pretences: It has been ascertained by the Whangarei police that accused is identical with William John Davidson, alias Albert Dempsey, alias Bob Ryan, alias John Milson, referred to in *Police Gazette*, 1923, page 127, and Photographs, 1920, page 8, and following paragraph. Description: Age thirty-one, height 5 ft. 7½ in., labourer, native of New Zealand, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, hazel eyes, large nose, Crucifix, clasped hands, bracelet, snake, life-buoy, and star on left forearm; star and half-moon on back of left hand; star on back of right hand. **HIKURANGI.**—5th instant, on warrant for false pretences, William John Davidson, alias Albert Dempsey, &c., referred to in preceding paragraph. Accused obtained an overcoat value £4 18 6d. and £3 16s. 6d. cash from Alexander Sime, storekeeper, Whakapara, by means of a valueless cheque for £8 on the Bank of Australasia, Napier. **AUCKLAND.**—14th instant, on warrant for leaving New Zealand with the intention of failing to make adequate provision for the maintenance of his wife, Rebecca Ellen Thomson, and child, William Thomson, age fifty-three, height 5 ft. 10 in., carpenter, native of New Zealand, medium build, sallow complexion, grey hair and eyes, stooped. **AUCKLAND.**—28th February last, for false pretences, John Hamilton (name probably fictitious), age about fifty, height 5 ft. 8 in., strong build, fresh complexion, dark hair turning grey; dressed in a navy-blue-serge suit and dark-grey soft-felt hat. Accused obtained a pipe ("Kia Ora" and "Superfine" on it) and two packets of tobacco from Malcolm Wiseman, 20 Gladstone Road, Parnell, by falsely representing that he was an engineer from the Horahora Power-station. No warrant.

**AUCKLAND.**—George Morris, breach of Bankruptcy Act: A further warrant has now been issued for his arrest, charging him, that being a person adjudged bankrupt he did within twelve months before the presentation of a bankruptcy petition against him quit New Zealand and take with him part of his property to the amount of £20 or upwards that ought by law to be divided among his creditors. Description: Age about thirty-seven, height about 5 ft. 7 in., plumber and contractor, native of Australia, slight build, ruddy complexion, light-brown hair, grey eyes, prominent nose, thin face, prominent gold-filled teeth. He was a companion of A. B. Bernard, alias Bernard Bagley, who is wanted for a similar offence, vide *Police Gazette*, 1922, pages 314 and 419. If located in any State in Australia his arrest is desired. A reward of £100 will be paid to the person who first supplies information leading to the arrest. **AUCKLAND.**—15th instant, on warrant for failing to provide for the future maintenance of his unborn illegitimate child, John Shaw, age twenty-two, height about 5 ft. 7 in., fireman, strong build, curly fair hair, blue eyes, "Norah" and other tattooing on arms. He left the s.s. "Kaimanawa" at Westport about the 28th ultimo. Complainant, Mary Huntly.

AUCKLAND.—24th ultimo, for indecent assault on Sousie Smith, age five, **Man** (name unknown), age about twenty-one, height 5 ft. 5 in., medium build, dark hair and complexion. Accused induced the child to accompany him off the road near Grafton Bridge, where he committed the offence. **No warrant.** *arrested 22/10/24.*

WAIPIRO BAY.—7th March last, on **warrant** of commitment to Gisborne Prison for three months in default of paying £36 7s. 6d. fine and costs for unlawfully supplying liquor to a Native, **Horacio Acosta**, age twenty-eight, height 5 ft. 7 in., labourer, native of Argentine, medium build, dark complexion, black hair, brown eyes, peck-pitted face; usually dressed in riding-breeches and dark-tweed coat; speaks broken English, and frequents Maori pas. GISBORNE.—9th instant, on **warrant** for failing to comply with the terms of a maintenance order for the support of his illegitimate child, of whom Helena Maud Hill is the mother, **Daniel McKenzie**, age twenty-seven, height 5 ft. 10 in., labourer, native of New Zealand, medium build, dark hair and complexion, brown eyes, clean-shaved, a quarter-caste Maori. Arrears to 27th November last, £2 10s. *arrested 29/8/23*

RAURIMU.—30th April last, for failing to comply with the conditions of his release upon probation, **Andrew Hamilton**, age thirty, height 5 ft. 9½ in., labourer and farmer, native of Scotland, strong build, fresh complexion, auburn hair, grey eyes, dimple in chin, clean-shaved, scar on right shoulder; dressed in a blue suit and dark-felt hat; rolling gait. OHAKUNE.—16th instant, on **warrant** for indecent assault, **W. Anderson**, age about twenty-eight, height about 5 ft. 8 in., bushman, native of Sweden, strong build, fair fresh complexion, fair hair, long features; dressed in a blue suit and tan boots. Accused, who was boarding with Elizabeth Jones, went into her bedroom and committed the offence. *arrested 29/8/23*

TAIHAPE.—4th March last, on **warrant** of commitment to Wanganui Prison for one month in default of paying £3 2s. 1d., fine and costs for dynamiting fish, **Alfred Lester**, age forty-five, height 5 ft. 8½ in., labourer, native of New Zealand, stout build, fair complexion, fair hair, blue eyes; usually dressed in a grey suit; dirty appearance; fond of drink. *paid 7.11.23*

TAIHAPE.—1st instant, on **warrant** of commitment to Auckland Prison for fourteen days in default of paying £8 12s. 6d. arrears due on a maintenance order for the support of his illegitimate child, an inmate of Wellington Receiving Home, **Michael Joseph Rodden**, age about thirty-two, height 5 ft. 6 in., hairdresser, native of New Zealand, medium build, florid complexion, dark hair turning grey, blue eyes, drooped nose; usually dressed in a grey suit and light-felt hat; fond of drink. *arrested 18/7/23*

RAETHI.—16th instant, on **warrant** for forgery and uttering, **Ernie Wilkinson**, age about twenty-four, height about 5 ft. 5 in., labourer, native of England, strong build, fallow complexion, black hair; may be dressed in a light-grey suit with "Broadway" on tab of coat. Accused stole from his employer, Michael Tansey, farmer, a blank cheque, which he drew for £15 6s., forged his employer's signature to it, and uttered it to Alexander Millar, storekeeper. PALMERSTON NORTH.—18th instant, on **warrant** for failing to maintain his wife, Evelyn Maud Wallbank, Longburn, **Edgar Wallbank**, age twenty-one, height 5 ft. 6 in., baker, native of England, slight build, fair complexion, ginger hair, blue eyes, upper front teeth missing, clean-shaved; dressed in a grey suit, greenish-felt hat, and brown-tweed overcoat. His photograph is filed in the Inspector's Office, Palmerston North. He may endeavour to leave this Dominion. *arrested 4/7/23*

PETONE.—2nd instant, for forgery and uttering, **George Bennett** (name probably fictitious), age about twenty-one, height 5 ft. 8 in., slight build, pale complexion; dressed in a grey suit and cap. Accused forged the signature of W. Donovan to a cheque for £8 10s., and uttered it to John Parker English, licensee, Victoria Hotel, in payment for two days' board and lodging, receiving £7 12s. 6d. cash. He endorsed the cheque "George Bennett." **No warrant.**
