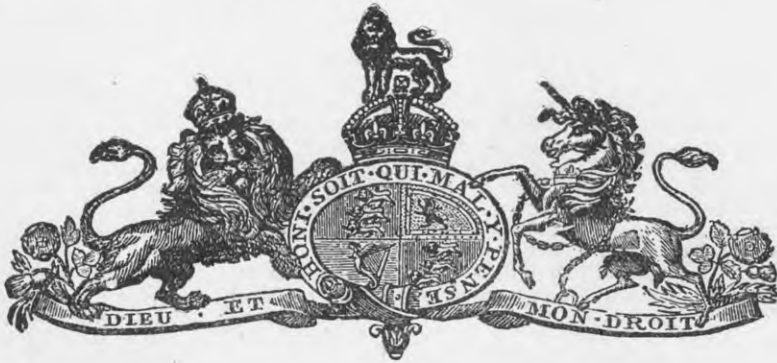

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with theft, or suspected of theft, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, shall be furnished for insertion in the *Gazette*.

## PERSONS WANTED.

**AUCKLAND.**—4th May last, for attempted buggery with Oswald Maurice, schoolboy, 18 Norman Street, **Man** (name unknown), age about thirty, height about 5 ft. 5 in., strong build, ruddy complexion, long prominent chin, clean-shaved; dressed in a grey suit and cap. Whilst in George Street about 9.30 p.m. on above date Oswald Maurice was forced by accused into the bush at the roadside, where the offence was committed. **No warrant.**
