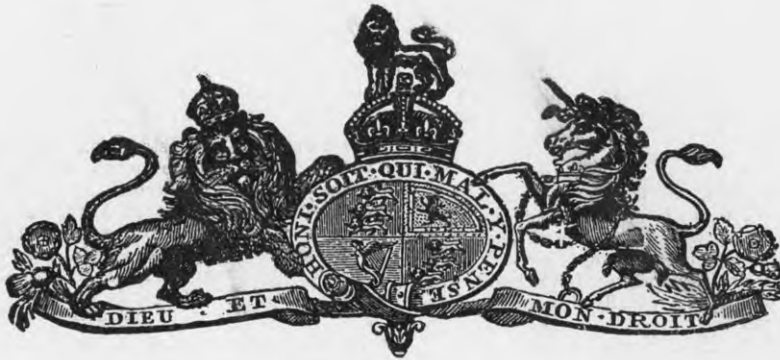

### INQUIRIES, ETC., FROM OUTSIDE NEW ZEALAND.

BRISBANE (QUEENSLAND).—Inquiries are requested for John Nelson, alias George Nelson, alias William Saunders, alias John Wilson, alias John Wallace (for photograph and description see New Zealand Police Gazette, 1920, page 139, and Queensland Police Gazette, 1921, page 129). He was bailed to appear at the Supreme Court, Brisbane, on the 11th instant, on a charge of breaking, entering, and theft, but failed to appear, and his recognizances were estreated. He is an expert safe-breaker, and is usually armed. He works on wharves, is well acquainted with firemen on ships, who may assist him to leave Australia. He dresses well in a blue-serge or very dark-tweed suit, black or grey Stetson hat, black patent-leather boots or tan shoes, and he obtained a quantity of black dye for his hair, which is turning grey. #### Scale of Pay.

The following revised scale of pay has been authorized, and will take effect as from the 1st October, 1923. Increments to all members of the Force will be calculated from the date of appointment to the respective ranks.

Superintendents: To commence at £525 per annum and advance to £600 by annual increments of £25.

Inspectors: To commence at £470 per annum and advance to £500 by annual increments of £15.

Sub-Inspectors: £440 per annum.

Senior Sergeants and Senior Detectives: To commence at 20s. per diem and advance to 21s. per diem by increments of 6d. per diem every two years.

Sergeants and Detective-Sergeants: To commence at 18s. per diem and advance to 19s. per diem by increments of 6d. per diem every two years.

Constables and Detectives:—	s. d.
On enrolment and under three years' service..	14 0
Over three years' and under six years' service	14 6
Over six years' and under nine years' service..	15 0

Matrons: To commence at £150 per annum and advance to £180 by increments of £10 every three years.

Surgeons: In four centres £150 per annum; at other places £25 per annum.

Probationary Constables: 11s. per diem.

#### DETECTIVE ALLOWANCE.

The scale of allowances to members of the Detective Branch shall be as follows: Chief Detectives, 3s. per diem; Senior Detectives, 2s. 6d. per diem; Detective-Sergeants, 3s. per diem; Detectives on appointment, 2s. 6d. per diem, increasing to 4s. per diem by increments of 6d. per diem every three years; Acting-Detectives, 1s. per diem.
