Sub-Inspectors: £440 per annum. Senior Sergeants and Senior Detectives: To commence at 20s. per diem and advance to 21s. per diem by

increments of 6d. per diem every two years.
Sergeants and Detective-Sergeants: To commence at 18s. per diem and advance to 19s. per diem by increments of 6d. per diem every two years. Constables and Detectives:—
