He is an ex-officer of the machine-gun corps and has a '45 Colt Service revolver. His photograph and a specimen of his handwriting are filed in the Commissioner's office, Wellington. A reward of £100, or such part of it as may seem fitting to the Chief Constable of Hove, will be paid to the first person (other than a police officer) giving information leading to the arrest of Bailey. If located, an urgent communication is to be sent to the Commissioner of Police, Wellington. (C.R. 24/100.)
