ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 4th day of March, 1924.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section forty-six of the Customs Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Orders in Council referred to in the Schedule hereto which prohibited the importation into New Zealand of the newspapers, periodical literature, and publications therein mentioned.

Nothing in this Order in Council shall be deemed to affect the provisions of the Order in Council made on the tenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and gazetted on the nineteenth day of May then instant, which prohibits the importation into New Zealand of any document which incites, encourages, advises, or advocates violence, lawlessness, or disorder, or expresses any seditious intention.
